## Meaning of Periplus

The word periplus stems from Greek, meaning 'journey' and also means a circumnavigation or sea voyage around a coastline. The use of a periplus, or journal, dates back to the second century and was a document listing in order, the ports and coastal landmarks, with approximate intervening distances, that the captain of a vessel could expect to find along a shore. In that sense the periplus was a type of log, similar to the modern day ship's log.

We use the term for our Club newsletter since it is the documentation of our travels at the Club and offshore and provides a historical record for us to reminisce and share with others. It is our shared and unique history as club members.

## PCYC ON THE WATER - VASILY BELOZEROFF

The 46th McNish Classic race is coming on July 29, and I had a chance to speak with Dick McNish about the race origin, memorable moments, and to simply enjoy the company of the man who sailed for 46 years in that same amazing race named after him. The boats in this classic race are made before 1954. They are all unique. Ask any owner – it takes effort to maintain them in a pristine shape, let alone to race them. The boats of today are sleek and efficient. They are beautiful, too, but not the same. There is something fascinating about wooden crafts, don't you think? Warm seas, pieces of eight, tea clippers, Joshua Slocum – take your pick for daydreaming!



We sat down for lunch with Dick at the Club. Not everybody knows that the race was started by Dick as Strathmore Cup in 1978 and later became McNish Classic Yacht Race. This was the origin of the skipper's weight in champagne as the first prize, which C.F. Koehler, owner of Sally, won last year. Back in the days, there were as many as 25 wooden boats racing. Imagine the sight! For those of us who have not seen it live, we owe thanks to Cheryl McMichael for sharing photos for this Periplus issue.

I asked Dick what is so special about the race, why do all these skippers keep coming back year after year? It is the camaraderie, he says. It is good to see friends. Champagne used to be better quality, too.



Yes, the friends... Some passed on, some don't race anymore. The community lost Walter Russakoff, builder of Vignette II, earlier this year – he was a dear friend to many sailors. Dick remembers he was a great sailor himself, always finding where the wind was, never cheating his handicap, always calm. He was the one putting the yellow light on the boat rafted farthest off the dock. Well known and well loved, Skipper Tim just passed two weeks ago, so the boat Fairwind will not be coming, the new owner said. So, it goes... But then there is Kevin Miller, former honorary PCYC member, who was a part of a winning boat, Rosebud,

August is here, and the water is warm, and the fish are everywhere. This is the start of the season where you have everything to pick from.

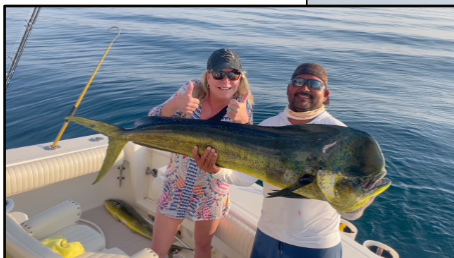

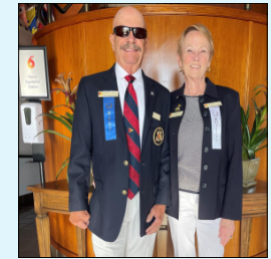

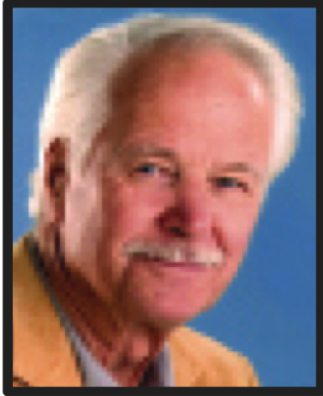
