Meaning of Periplus

The word periplus stems from Greek, meaning 'journey' and also means a circumnavigation or sea voyage around a coastline. The use of a periplus, or journal, dates back to the second century and was a document listing in order, the ports and coastal landmarks, with approximate intervening distances, that the captain of a vessel could expect to find along a shore. In that sense the periplus was a type of log, similar to the modern day ship's log.

We use the term for our Club newsletter since it is the documentation of our travels at the Club and offshore and provides a historical record for us to reminisce and share with others. It is our shared and unique history as club members.

During our stay we decided to do something that we rarely do when traveling. We used our Club's reciprocal agreement to dine at the Waikiki Yacht Club! It was a great experience and we now plan to use that special privilege more often when we travel.

Yacht club reciprocal benefits are agreements between two or more yacht clubs that allow members of one club to use the facilities and services of the other clubs.

When you are planning a trip, be sure to check with the PCYC front office to see if we have reciprocal agreements with yacht clubs in the area that you will be visiting. Also, check our PCYC 2023 printed roster. A list of Reciprocal Yacht Clubs begins on page 217. This way, you can enjoy all the amenities that other clubs have to offer without having to pay for membership in each club. The specific benefits that are offered through a reciprocal agreement will vary from club to club. It is important to check with the individual clubs to see what benefits are available.

Your laminated PCYC membership card is your reciprocal card. Always take it with you if you plan to visit other clubs. Often, the card is required to verify your membership in a reciprocal club. If a club you wish to visit does not already have a reciprocal agreement with PCYC, GM Don Meyers may be able to establish that relationship prior to your visit.



Here are some of the benefits of yacht club reciprocal agreements:

- Save money on travel: Reciprocal agreements can save you money on travel by allowing you to use the facilities and services of other yacht clubs. This can include things like short-term berthing.

- Enjoy the amenities of other yacht clubs: Reciprocal agreements can give you the opportunity to enjoy the amenities of other yacht clubs. This can include things like using the clubhouse and facilities and, eating at the restaurant.
- Meet new people: Reciprocal agreements can give you the opportunity to meet new people. This is especially true if you are traveling to a new area and do not know anyone.
- Learn about different yacht clubs: Reciprocal agreements can give you the opportunity to learn about different yacht clubs. This can be helpful if you are considering volunteering at PCYC.

I encourage you to try this out with some of the clubs closer to home and abroad as you travel. Just be sure to call ahead to ask if they have any reciprocal agreements with PCYC.

The captain becomes incapacitated or falls overboard. You purchase a new boat for the first time. **You are Suddenly in Command**. This boating safety primer is designed for those not generally at the helm, and will help you to be prepared with the basics in case of an emergency.

You will learn about your vessel, nomenclature, and operating principles such as starting the engine, basic boat handling, and your on board equipment. Included are descriptions of what causes boating mishaps and how to minimize them. This course is a must for family members in case something happens to the boat operator.

There will be no cost for attendees for this seminar. Practicing good recreational boating safety should be a #1 priority!

This training has saved lives and boats.

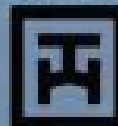

Five boats competed on an eight-mile course designed by Richard Dean in a thoughtful and creative way – the skippers enjoyed two (!) spinnaker runs and had a fun time discovering the turning marks. In the end, Cirrus came in first in less than two hours, followed by Wai'lani, Mahalo, and Selavy, with Driftwood DNF.

We tested the use of the RaceQs app in tracking the progress of boats – the app shows promise in a way of marking the end of the race by skippers themselves and by showing race progress as it happens. More to come as we are learning how to fine-tune the app.



The race committee photographer, Roger Hayne, did a wonderful job taking photos of the race start and finish and brought a slide show to Bill's Bar after the race so the sailors and sailor-wannabes could see the race photos on the big screen TVs. We plan to offer this photo-streaming, and potentially video-streaming as our technology evolves, on the club TVs as a standard feature, so more to come.

We have updated the Club web page to better organize the Race Committee activities under the Race Bulletin Board – we hope that the members and sailors alike will be able to navigate to the race documents such as Notice of Race, Sailing Instructions, and Registration Forms. Many thanks to Ron Dreher for implementing these changes for us, and for his patience!

We will resume the TGIS series in the fall, so do not park your boats just yet! Oh, and the big events are coming – we are nearing the McCune Race followed by the Cheeseburgers in Paradise party on June 3. SUMMER SLAM FISHING TOURNAMENT 2023

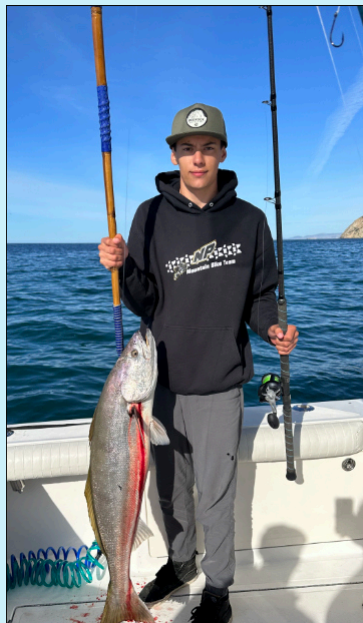
Hello fellow anglers-

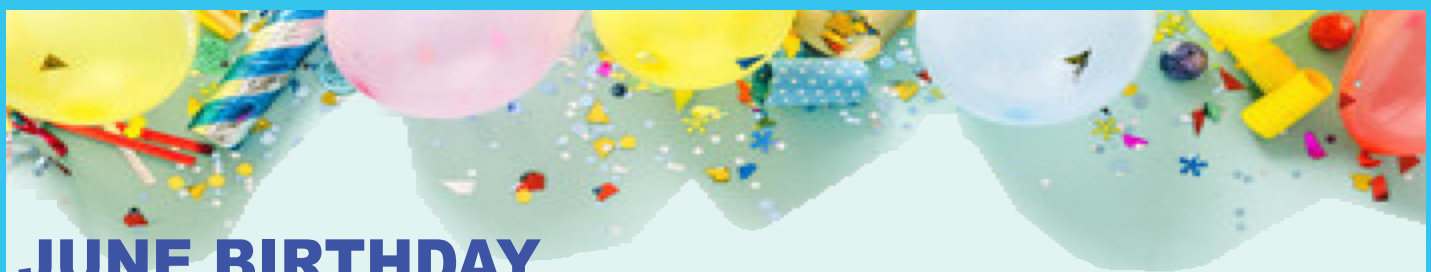
