Meaning of Periplus

The word periplus stems from Greek, meaning 'journey' and also means a circumnavigation or sea voyage around a coastline. The use of a periplus, or journal, dates back to the second century and was a document listing, in order, the ports and coastal landmarks, with approximate intervening distances, that the captain of a vessel could expect to find along a shore. In that sense the periplus was a type of log, similar to the modern day ship's log.

We use the term for our Club newsletter since it is the documentation of our travels at the Club and offshore and provides a historical record for us to reminisce and share with others. It is our shared and unique history as club members.

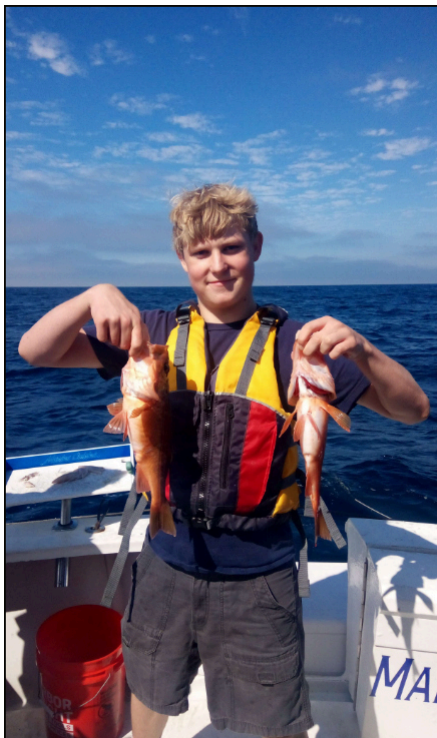
PCYF - STAFF COMMODORE TOM SHIDELER

In the past my articles have focused on boating related topics. This month a short article on an entirely different subject matter - Wifi.

In the spring, an informal IT committee started looking at the technology assets of the Club. We did an audit of all things related. A lot of areas for improvement were identified. We also heard from Club members. The most glaring short coming was the lack of a reliable guest wifi for the Club members. There was some guest wifi downstairs, with virtually no guest wifi in Bill's Bar, the Crow's Nest and the pool area.

The reason was simple. There were no wifi access points installed. We went out for bids to three companies and selected a vendor. We now should have robust wifi in the above-mentioned areas. This should enhance the membership experience by allowing more reliable zoom meetings at the Club and streaming video and pictures on our 72 inch monitors. We even have wifi down on the dock.

I did a speed test at the various locations, and I was getting anywhere from 50Mbps download all the way up to 250Mbps. Of course, it will vary depending on how many people are on the wifi and the line of sight to the antenna.

There are more IT projects/improvements to come.

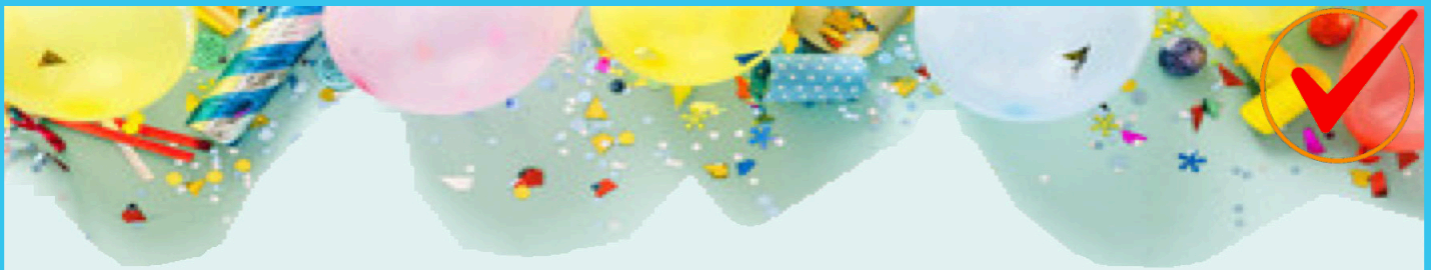

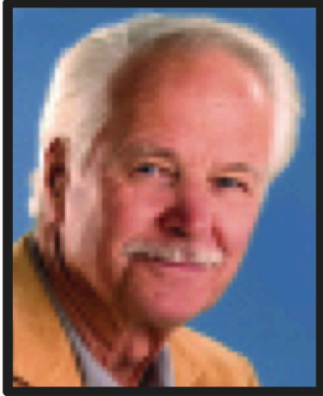
