Meaning of Periplus

The word periplus stems from Greek, meaning 'journey' and also means a circumnavigation or sea voyage around a coastline. The use of a periplus, or journal, dates back to the second century and was a document listing in order, the ports and coastal landmarks, with approximate intervening distances, that the captain of a vessel could expect to find along a shore. In that sense the periplus was a type of log, similar to the modern day ship's log.

We use the term for our Club newsletter since it is the documentation of our travels at the Club and offshore and provides a historical record for us to reminisce and share with others. It is our shared and unique history as club members.

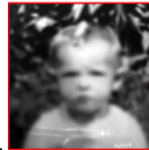

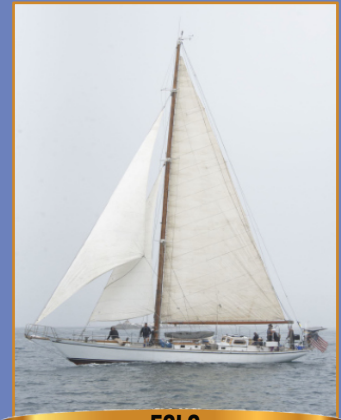

SKIPPER OF SHIP 9201, LOCKSMITH, AND LOCAL HERO

Skipper Dave VadBunker may not be a familiar face to the general membership of PCYC,, but he is an indispensable friend to the Pacific Corinthian Youth Foundation (PCYF). For those members not familiar, the Foundation is NOT a Club organization, but a separate 501(c)3 charity organized by yacht club members to promote youth sailing in the Ventura area. The Foundation, currently led by our own Board President, Tom Shideler, provides space within the Grotto to store PCYF boats & supplies and supports the Youth Sailing Program by allowing PCYF activities on Club property. The Youth Foundation charters Sea Scout Ship 9201, and Dave is the Skipper (Adult Scout Leader).

I sat down with Skipper Dave at the Club recently to discuss Sea Scout involvement with PCYF. According to Skipper VadBunker, Ship 9201 currently has about 11 active Sea Scouts and just as with other Boy Scout Troops, these young people participate in their own broad-based merit badge programs aimed at developing their skills from a nautical perspective. The Foundation supports the Sea Scouts of Ship 9201 by providing them with a meeting place, access to Youth Foundation boats & gear, and dock space for their activities. As a community service, Sea Scouts clean and maintain Foundation sail boats, storage facilities, and sailing/life saving gear used in the Sailing Program. Recently,

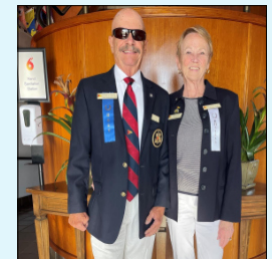
Skipper VadBunker and Sea Scouts were instrumental in replacing a dysfunctional outboard motor equipment storage shed with a secure, fire-extinguisher-equipped storage container. Sea Scouts assisted in demolishing an old PCYF equipment shed prior to Bridge Support Maintenance within the Grotto. When an old floating dock used to store sailboats during Youth Sail Class failed, Skipper VadBunker personally towed away and disposed of the old dock AND assisted in assembling a new floating dock for Program use. Skipper Dave has also developed Sea Scout access to sailing & kayaking resources provided by Fairwinds Yacht Club to further educate Scouts in the art of Sailing.

Dave VadBunker is not alone in managing Ship 9201. Among those volunteers assisting Skipper Dave are PCYF Board Member Tom Danza, Jamie Garrison, Paris Picard, Dave & Marie Edison, recently deceased David Wolfe, and others.

PCYF and all its board members wish to thank Skipper Dave VadBunker and Ship 9201 for their faithful work in support of the Youth Foundation Sailing Program.

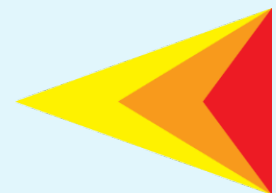
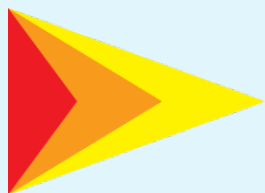

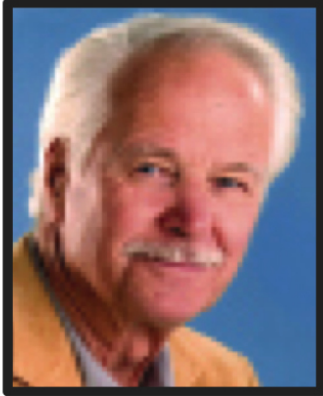
