Meaning of Periplus

The word periplus stems from Greek, meaning 'journey' and also means a circumnavigation or sea voyage around a coastline. The use of a periplus, or journal, dates back to the second century and was a document listing in order, the ports and coastal landmarks, with approximate intervening distances, that the captain of a vessel could expect to find along a shore. In that sense the periplus was a type of log, similar to the modern day ship's log.

We use the term for our Club newsletter since it is the documentation of our travels at the Club and offshore and provides a historical record for us to reminisce and share with others. It is our shared and unique history as club members.

We have new members who join and need some exposure to ocean traditions. If you meet a new member, pass a little piece of what you know along — even in Bill’s Bar!

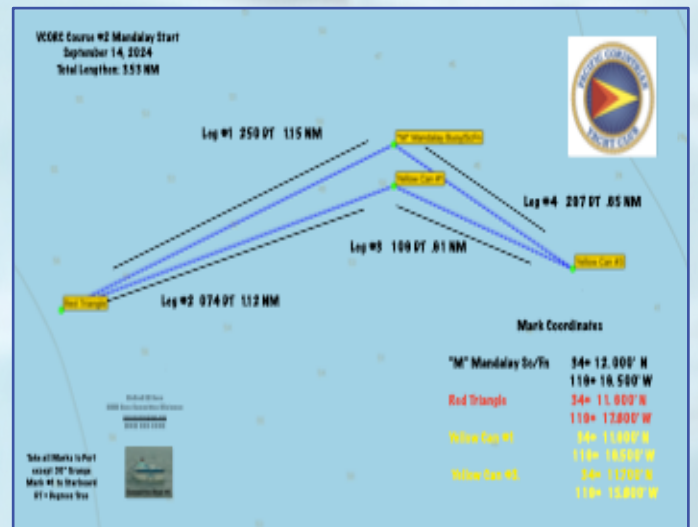
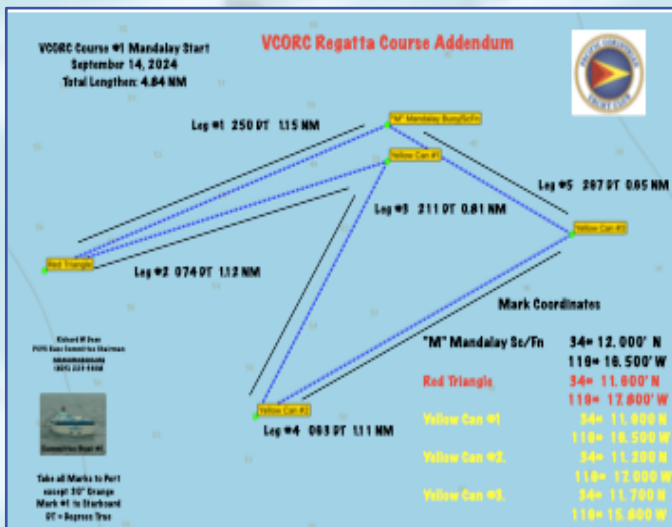

BYLAW AMENDMENT PROPOSAL
GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING AUGUST 16, 2024**

On June 20, 2024, and July 18, 2024, the Board of Directors voted their approval and recommendation of the following amendments to the Club's Bylaws. These amendments will be presented for your consideration and vote, at the Quarterly General Membership Meeting on August 16, 2024. (The current Bylaws are available on the bulletin board at the end of the hall and in the back of your Club ROSTER.)

NOTE: In the following Articles, the proposed deleted wording is identified by *italic strikethrough* and the proposed new amendments are identified by **underlined bold italic**.

ARTICLE 6 – ELECTION OF MEMBER

Synopsis: Amending Bylaw Article 6.4 clarifying Board approved procedures.

6.4 Applications for membership shall be considered on a first-come-first-served basis by the Board of Directors at the next Regular Board Meeting, which is not sooner than ten (10) days following the aforesaid notification of members. Completed Applications and Agreements submitted by eligible persons shall be **voted on** ~~granted membership~~ by the Board of Directors ~~unless the membership limit has been reached.~~ **when membership levels remain within established limits.**

ARTICLE 9 – MEETINGS OF THE MEMBERSHIP

Synopsis: Addition of article 9.8 for compliance with Robert's Rules of Order and state law.

9.8 All membership notices and mailings required by these Bylaws may be sent by electronic notice (e-mail), or by posting to the password-protected website accessible only to Club members when a member has consented to receive such electronic notice. Any member may revoke their consent to receive electronic notice by providing written notice to the Secretary.

This year, we will have a special T-shirt available for purchase with proceeds going to our PCYC donation goal. Please look out for details in our email blasts.

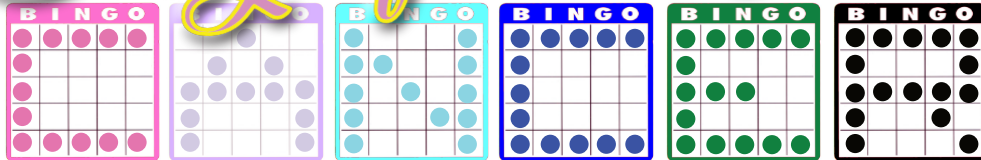
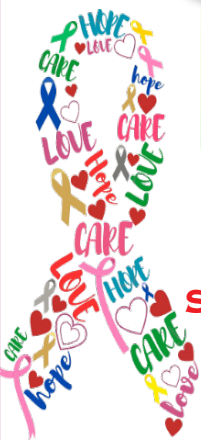
