Meaning of Periplus



The word periplus stems from Greek, meaning 'journey' and also means a circumnavigation or sea voyage around a coastline. The use of a periplus, or journal, dates back to the second century and was a document listing in order, the ports and coastal landmarks, with approximate intervening distances, that the captain of a vessel could expect to find along a shore. In that sense the periplus was a type of log, similar to the modern day ship's log.

We use the term for our Club newsletter since it is the documentation of our travels at the Club and offshore and provides a historical record for us to reminisce and share with others. It is our shared and unique history as club members.

I would like to reflect on the year from the R/C perspective, and share my thoughts about future directions. First of all, I want to sincerely thank the chairs of the committees under the R/C flag who did such a wonderful job in their programs: Kate Thompson for social, Kimberly Alford for Ladies Who Do Lunch, Linda Allen for family circle, Dwight McCann as a photographer, Cheryl McMichael as a historian, Marley Yokaitis for the Parade Of Lights, Richard Dean as the Race Committee chairman. Their commitment to these roles allowed me to dedicate time to creating a vision and a path for junior sailing at the Club.

As a brief update, we will expand our partnership with Pacific Corinthian Youth Foundation (www.pcyfsailing.org/copy-about) all year round in the format similar to their sailing summer camp. This means that we will have kids sailing at the dock on a monthly basis and calendar these activities to avoid conflicts with other events at the dock.



All community kids will be able to participate for a fee like they do in the summer, and Club



members' kids will have a discount via membership incentive – a way to interest younger families with kids to join the Club.

This partnership between the Club and the Youth Foundation is a common way to arrange junior sailing exemplified by Santa Barbara Yacht Club, among others. We have created a junior sailing committee whose role will be to coordinate with the PCYF scheduling, and fundraising. We also outfitted a Capri-14 on which we piloted a small sailing lessons program. The Capri boat is ready for use by members – my vision is to create opportunities for families to go sailing together and to foster junior sailing. We have agreed with the boards of PCYC and PCYF that this is a good way forward.

PCYC MEMBER BOAT PROFILE: VALKYRIE

Anita and Tom Petersen are without a doubt amongst the most experienced of boat owners in the Club. They have owned and operated dozens of boats. The current pride of the fleet is Valkyrie. You may have been aboard her at the PCYC guest dock on opening day or seen her in the 2023 Parade of Lights.

Valkyrie is a SeaRay Model L650fly with a length overall of 65 feet and a beam of 18 feet. She has twin 1200HP Caterpillar Engines. The name Valkyrie is derived from Norse mythology with an English translation of angels. Over the five years of ownership, she has taken the Petersen family underway from San Francisco to San Diego, with plans to points beyond.



Cruising in Valkyrie is the very definition of ocean-going luxury. Be it to the local islands or a week cruise up to Monterey,, Valkyrie will get the Captain and crew to destinations in true yachting style. She supports four staterooms and a seriously capable galley. Captain Tom loves to cook.

Valkyrie also serves as a vessel for the advancement of ocean research. The International SeaKeepers Society supports marine science and conservation by utilizing privately owned yachts as platforms for oceanographic research. Valkyrie, being part of that, has been used by CSU Long Beach SharkLab for multi-day Great White Shark tagging and research. Also California Ocean Alliance work with Hump-back whales, U.S.

Navy work with Dolphins to see how sub-sonars affect behavior of marine mammals, UCLA and NOAA with abalone and other unique studies.

Valkyrie is a great, all-around yacht . Big enough to take long distances or lengthy trips, agile enough to maneuver in tight harbors. Great for a cruise for one or two, and big enough to entertain a group. The Petersens have had up to 50 guests aboard!
