The Southern California Yachting Association (SCYA) had a 2024 Installation and Awards Ceremony hosted by the Westlake Yacht Club, which I had the privilege to attend on January 13. This was my first time getting a closer introduction to SCYA and learning about their mission and activities, so I wanted to briefly share with my fellow club members a few highlights.

SCYA is a regional recreational yachting and boating organization, recognized by US Boating and US Sailing, that services yacht clubs from Santa Barbara to San Diego, and inland to Nevada and Arizona. SCYA provides a single platform for the participating clubs to communicate and coordinate their respective activities in one forum.

Our club is among over 90 club members and as such has access to various benefits including coordination of boating activities, education for boat safety and other topics, celebrating and recognizing yacht club and association quality programs, commending sailors and power boaters for their skills and Corinthian spirit, and providing communication through the SCYA website (<https://scya.org/>), yearly publications, and meetings allowing members to connect. In addition, the association informs the general boating community of special legislation that can impact the boating community. SCYA has been providing these services for over 95 years.

As your new Rear Commodore, I will be attending a training seminar by SCYA to learn the ropes of this Bridge position from other participating clubs and hope to put this education to work at PCYC. On the sailing front, we have started the year with the annual Race Committee planning meeting where Race Committee Chair Richard Dean and Assistant Chair Mark Slothower reviewed the Club's racing program for 2024 and described the operations of the Race Committee and specific roles. MEMBER NOTICE

Dear PCYC Members,

Our Club's guest frequency policies are outlined below. Hopefully, this information will answer any questions you may have about the frequency of non-member/reciprocal guest visits to PCYC. As you are aware, compliance with these policies is part of your contractual agreement as a member and a necessary and integral facet of your membership in a private club. Please refer to Clubhouse Rule number's 6, 7, & 22. Thank you for your cooperation in following the Club's guest policies.

GUEST POLICIES

FOUR (4) VISITS PER CALENDAR YEAR - This four-visit rule is standard for all guests.

Guest Badges: All guests must register at the Front Desk each time they visit. They are to give their first and last name and provide identification when requested. Guest badges must be worn in and around the Club at all times and/or be visible to the servers and other staff so that they can properly identify your guest.

Private Parties: Non-members attending events that are not sponsored by the Club shall leave the premises immediately following the event. Should a PCYC member invite such a non-member to remain at the Club following the event, said guest must register at the Front Desk to receive their guest badge. This will count toward the four visits.

Reciprocity: Non-members who belong to another yacht club that PCYC has a reciprocal relationship with must register at the Front Desk and provide proper identification and a current reciprocal membership card. Each of these visits plus any additional visits as guests of a PCYC member count toward the four visits. With a timely reservation and subject to the reciprocity agreement and General Manager's discretion, the reciprocal member may invite guests who must also register at the Front Desk and receive their guest badge.

Credit Cards: Guests using a Club-approved credit card (Mastercard or Visa) will be charged the prevailing non-member fee. They may not pay by cash or check.

EXCEPTIONS TO THE FOUR-VISIT RULE

1. Immediate family members may attend with the member at any time: parents, grandparents, siblings, blood and adopted children, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren. Relatives over twenty-one (21) may also, with the written permission of the member, use the Club three times per calendar year without being accompanied by the member. This does not apply to friends of the relative.
2. Racers, Fishermen and Boaters: The attendance at a Club-sponsored race or tournament related events when actively participating in the event. Boaters from a visiting yacht club, registered to utilize a designated portion of the PCYC Guest Dock, may request a 'three-day visitors pass' that will only count as a single visit.
3. Military: Members of the armed services and/or Coast Guard Auxiliary, when in uniform and attending the Club as a guest of a member.
4. Personal care attendant: This is someone who is hired by the member to help the member with their personal care and needs. The member must notify Club Management and complete the Personal Care Attendant Registration Form available in the accounting office.
5. Past Commodores: A Board designated Past Commodore of the Club who is no longer a member.
6. Ladies Who Do Lunch: The October luncheon only, which is a charity event.
7. The General Manager may, at his/her discretion approve guest visits in "special" circumstances not noted above.

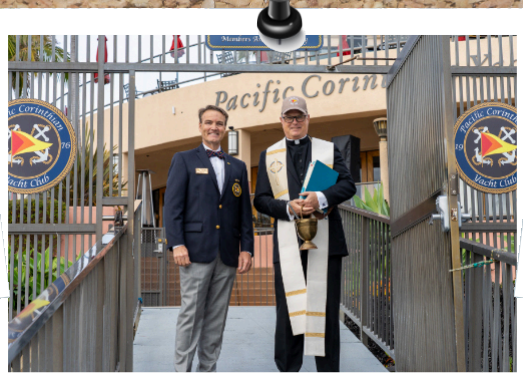

Sea Scout Ship 9201

We start the new year with some new challenges and new ideas. The mainstay vessel for youth sailing programs since 1939 has been the US Sabot manufactured by Catalina Yachts. We still have and use a small group of these boats. Each season of repeating the process hundreds of times of taking them out of the yard, placing them in the water, rigging them, sailing them, unrigging them, and putting them back in the yard, the boats simply become just a little tired. Some of these faithful 8-foot boats have been replaced by 7-foot 9-inch Optimus or "Opti" sailboats. Both designs of boats can handle two small sailors or one larger student.

We are finding more students return to the program each year to continue their skill development. It is amazing how much these young people grow each year! We believe their parents are feeding them quite well. Bigger kids need bigger boats. As their skills increase, they can move up to our Lasers or Flying Junior (FJ) boats. However, we are considering the purchase of a few RS Tera Pro 9-foot 5-inch boats to bridge this gap. RS Sailing is a UK company and has been in business since 1957. Their boats are sold worldwide. We are looking forward to this addition to our fleet.

Sea Scout Ship 9201 has gone through the administrative task of submitting the annual charter documentation to BSA. The Ship has become the leading "on-the-water" training facility where BSA troops can earn their required boating merit badges. Ship 9201 is also actively involved with the Coast Guard Auxiliary in on-board training exercises. This is a very active group, and we are proud of them.

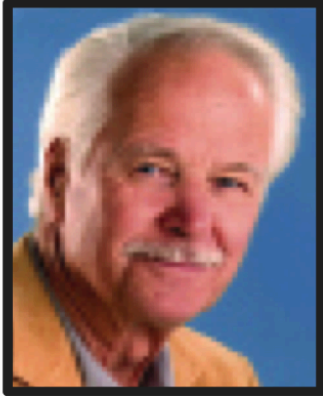
