### PLACEMENT OF BURGEE OR ORGANIZATIONAL FLAGS



Power or Electric - At the bow on an appropriate bow staff. Today it is also proper to display secondary burgees or organizational flags on the starboard spreaders, outriggers, or radio antennas.

Sail - The modern practice is of the starboard spreader. This avoids interference with masthead antennas, wind instruments, etc. Vessels with two or more masts would use the foremost spreader. When using the starboard spreader and displaying more than one burgee, organizational, officer, or private signal flag, the primary burgee would occupy the uppermost position. The traditional location is at the masthead on a staff called a "pigstick", and this is still acceptable.

**CLUBHOUSE RULE**

**NOTIFICATION**

**On June 20, 2024**

**the Board of Directors approved amendments to Clubhouse Rule:**

**15. Charges and Payments** – All Club dues, monthly charges or bi-monthly minimums, and sales transactions with a member shall be charged to the member's account. Member charges are payable upon billing, which is due by the end of the month. Failure to pay the full amount due by the end of the billing month will result in a late fee of \$25.00, which will be added to outstanding account bills **over** \$25.00, each month until paid. Pursuant to direction of the Board of Directors, the General Manager shall automatically suspend all membership privileges with any balance exceeding sixty (60) days payable. Suspended member shall not be allowed to attend the Club and shall remain suspended until all Indebtedness to the Club has been paid. Monthly dues and bi-monthly minimums, plus late fees will continue to accrue until paid in full. If indebtedness has still not been resolved within sixty (60) days of suspension notification (120 days from initial billing), membership will be automatically terminated/expelled.

Cash shall not be used by members, and credit cards may not be used for individual transactions by members. Members may **only** pay their monthly bill:

1. by check, or

2. on-line

- by Club accepted credit card, Visa, or Master Card, and paying the convenience fee indicated on the bill not to exceed 4%.

- by ACH (Automatic Clearing House) direct bank withdrawal, with no convenience fee

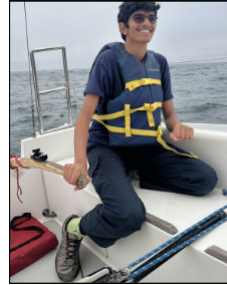
Guests shall use Club accepted credit cards provided they have properly registered at the front desk as required in CH Rule 7. A non-member/reciprocal fee shall be added to their bill. Guests may **only** use cash when the General Manager designates this form of payment for limited **Club sponsored events**.

Attention PCYC cruisers... your feed-back and ideas for future PCYC cruise events are needed AND wanted. Last year some of the PCYC cruisers provided feedback that they would like to see more cruises that involve our local islands, and based on that feedback, four local island cruises were scheduled into this year's calendar.

### **July 18-23 – Two Harbors, Catalina.**

Located on Catalina's west end, Two Harbors is a mere 22 miles from the Southern California mainland. This rustic village sits on a narrow strip of land that separates Isthmus Cove on the leeward side of the island from Catalina Harbor on the windward side. Stay in Two Harbors or Catalina Harbor, your choice.

### **August 22-25 – Cove hop on Santa Cruz Island.**

Santa Cruz Island is the largest of the Channel Islands, off the coast of Southern California. Its many sea caves include the vast Painted Cave, on the northwestern side. We will be "cove hopping" from Smugglers, to Prisoners Cove, to Forney Cove, to Coches (actual coves will be dependent on weather).

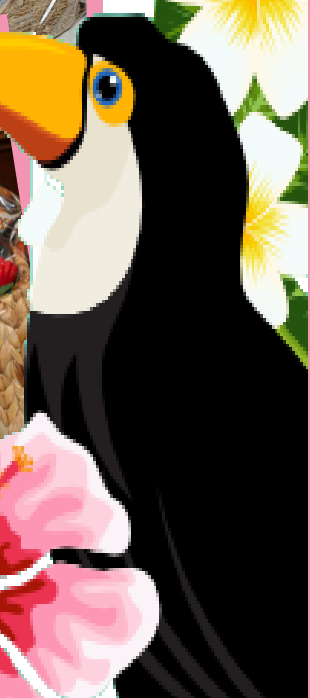

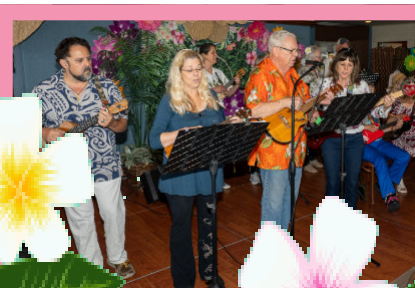

## PCYC MEMBER BOAT PROFILE: CHEERIO II, OWNER DICK MCNISH

Cheerio II is without a doubt the most storied boat at PCYC and points beyond. It is owned by our very own Dick McNish, who recently turned ninety-seven. Cheerio II is 93 years young. Dick grew up in Santa Barbara and served in World War II being part of the

g r e a t e s t generation. He also happens to be one of the nicest people in the Club. Cheerio was built in San Pedro, CA, by Fellows and Stuart, a ship builder that started in 1896 on Terminal Island. Cheerio is in good company. Stuart and Fellows also built Rudolf Valentino's yacht Charade. Cheerio was previously owned by Errol Flynn. The Ranger built in 1917 is up at the Santa Barbara Maritime Museum. The ship builder made a significant contribution to World War II, having built wooden hull rescue boats and submarine chasers.

Cheerio was purchased by Dick in 1980 and rebuilt in 1994. Cheerio has a length overall of

56 feet. In the early years Dick sailed and cruised Cheerio all the way up the Pacific Northwest. She has also been a regular in the international race the Newport to Ensenada. Her interior exudes a warmth that is hard to replicate on modern day fiberglass boats.

Cheerio II is most famous in the last decades as being part of the McNish Classic. This is a classic sailboat race started by Dick in the 1970s. This year the race will be celebrating a 47-year tradition. It is open to wooden sailboats built before 1954. Boats from up and down the West Coast come to this race. Dennis Conner of America's Cup fame has participated aboard several of his boats including Splendor and Brush Fire. He usually wins. The race uses a reverse start whereby the slower boats start first. This year's McNish classic is July 27.

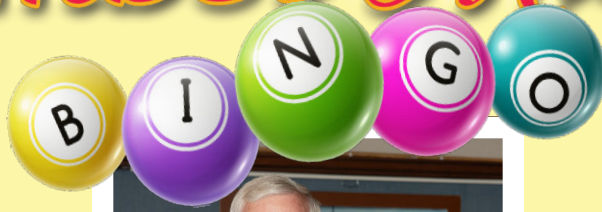
