THE BURGEE EXCHANGE

The Burgee, a small triangle flag adorned with club insignias, is our symbol of connection and friendship among sea faring communities. A practice of exchanging burgees with visiting yacht clubs is one of several traditions and practices that build bonds, camaraderie, sportsmanship and mutual respect. It is customary for the visiting club to present their Burgee to the host as a gesture of goodwill and respect. In return the hosting club reciprocates, cementing the bond between the two communities.

Hats Off is an Axopar 28 Aft cabin owned and operated by Don and Grace Gehman. The Axopar is a sleek and sporty European import with a very distinctive go-fast look. It looks longer than its 30 foot LOA. It has a nine-foot beam. It has a warm cabin with commanding views that is perfect for the cool conditions of our local waters.



Mercury Verrado 350HP outboard allows Hats Off to cruise at 30 knots! This puts Anacapa Island within reach in 20 minutes, 12 minutes to Ventura Harbor and 30 minutes to Santa Barbara. A trip to Santa Barbara in calm conditions is likely faster in Hats Off than by car on the 101 freeway. A very compelling value proposition.

The Gehmans have owned four previous boats before acquiring Hats Off here in Channel Islands Harbor. The Axopars are known for their sporty and sleek lines. Don and Grace love to take day trips out into the Santa Barbara Channel. A

Hats Off is a picnic boat that can also accommodate the occasional overnight trip.

The Gehmans thoroughly enjoyed the PCYC cruise aboard Hats Off to Santa Barbara.

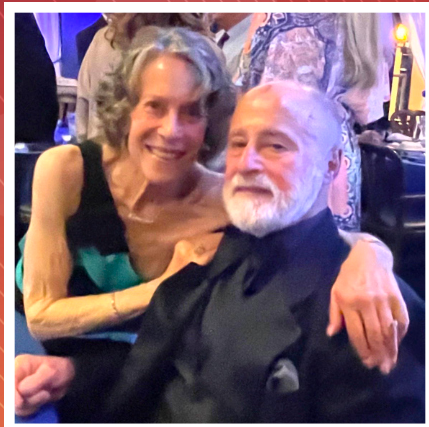

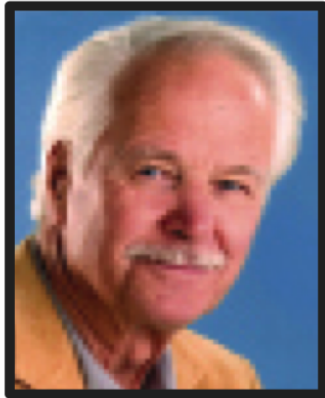
