My family and I went cruising in the BVI last month. The four of us chartered a 44' monohull "Good Decision" from Conch Charters in Tortola <https://conchcharters.com/>, and spent a week going from island to island. We left Road Town marina on Saturday and picked a mooring ball at Norman island where Willy T's floating bar was the favorite, and yes, we jumped in the water from the top deck. Then we went to Marina Cay next morning to get ahead of the weather – a bit of wind and a northern swell was in the forecast. We loved paddle boarding around the harbor, and went on shore to hang out at the Scrub Island resort and spa (Why not sail with comfort, right?) <https://www.scrubisland.com/>



From there, we went to North Sound in Virgin Gorda and stayed with the good friends of the Bitter End Yacht Club for a couple of days <https://beyc.com/>, having dinner at the Saba Rock (there is a small island, and there is a restaurant on that island, a good one, too <https://sabarock.com/> ). We took a taxi to southern end of Virgin Gorda to see the Baths. The ride was better than a rollercoaster, kids loved it, and the Baths, well, everybody must see the Baths, and I will just leave it at that. <https://www.bvinpt.org/the-baths>

Our last destination was at the Cooper Island – jumping from the boat into the pristine warm waters, snorkeling on the reef, and having dinner at the Cooper Island Beach Club. <https://>

[cooperislandbeachclub.com/](https://cooperislandbeachclub.com/) Oh, and they have a bar with the best rum selection in BVI, I kid you not – over 350 kinds of rum!

We live in a beautiful place here, and our Channel Island area is wonderful for sailing and cruising. But I will tell you the BVI experience takes it to a different level. You see, the waters there are warm and clear, the winds are warm, the sail-grounds are protected by the islands so you are never really exposed to big seas, and the islands and marinas are plenty, accessible, and well equipped with mooring balls which you can pre-book on line <https://boatyball.com/>, there are many anchorages and docking options. Also, there are things to do on shore and in the water, and each leg of the journey can be done inside an hour if you wish, so you can sail for a while, but if you don't want to, you don't have to. Nice to have options, especially with a family on board so you can simply mess about in the boat... Our boat by the way was great – the marine heads are next generation so no pumping required (!), we had a generator, a microwave, and an AC; my pre-ordered provisions were delivered when we arrived. So yes that was a bit Portside Out Starboard Home, but still less than a catamaran, which we will do next time, I hope. And for a full disclosure, I did manage to pour fresh water into the holding tank once but luckily that was the extent of the embarrassing moments.

So what can I tell you folks other than it was unreal, and we will do it again – we have left Jost Van Dyke with their Soggy Dollar bar and Foxy's and Anegada with their famous lobsters untouched for a reason. And when we go, we hope to see you there.

## PCYC JUDGE ADVOCATE CRAIG LAIDIG

What does membership in Pacific Corinthian Yacht Club (PCYC) mean? It means you support boating and the oceans. For some, it is also a place to enjoy a fine meal and talk with friends. For others, it may be a place to lounge by the pool or jacuzzi. Still others enjoy pulling up on the guest dock and having a drink in Bill's Bar. Ultimately, it is an organization at law devoted to yachting and related activities involving nautical experiences we share.

Membership in PCYC means you are part of a unique legal organization. Technically, PCYC is a member corporation granted nonprofit, tax exempt status under Internal Revenue Code, Section 501(c)(7). These nonprofit social clubs encompass a wide variety of organizations, from local country clubs to fraternal lodges and of course yacht clubs. The unifying element is their primary purpose: to provide pleasure, recreation, and other non-profitable benefits to their members.

To maintain this unique legal status, there are several important obligations we must follow. At a minimum, the club must follow these specific requirements:

- 1. Membership:** A defined membership structure with clear eligibility criteria and a process for admission and expulsion, not open to the general public.
- 2. Exempt Purpose:** The organization must provide social and recreational activities for its members. In our case, PCYC is established to promote boating, as stated in our bylaws.
- 3. Financial Support:** The organization should primarily be funded by dues, fees, and assessments paid by its members. This ensures

that the benefits provided are reciprocal and not subsidized by external sources. The tax exemption is given with an understanding that the social group is using its own funds to promote the activity.

- 4. Non-profitability:** The organization's activities should be conducted on a nonprofit basis. Excess income must be reinvested back into the organization for the benefit of its members.



- 5. Non-discrimination:** The organization's governing documents must not contain any discriminatory provisions based on race, color, or religion.

While these criteria create the essential framework, navigating the nuances can be complex. While member contributions remain the primary source of funding, limited income from non-members is permitted. Exceeding the limits can jeopardize our exempt status. Similarly, non-member use of facilities is very limited, and must be carefully documented for Internal Revenue Service purposes (one of the reasons we require members to wear their I.D. Badges and all guests must check in at the front desk).

An important reminder in all of this for members is that we exist only from our member support -- financially for the day-to-day operations, maintenance, staffing, insurance, and practically by the many functions that are directed by the Board and Bridge and supported by our committees filled with members. By defined purpose, we should have 100% participation in club support. When you consider all of the needs for this significant nonprofit enterprise, there is something of interest for everyone. If you have not already, please join one of our events, meet new people, have fun and support our great club!

You are not eligible to serve on this Nominating Committee if you have served on the Nominating Committee in the past year. However, Staff Commodores may serve two (2) years in a row.

By serving on this Committee, you will be making a very important contribution to PCYC.

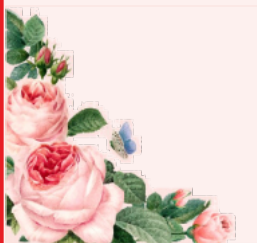

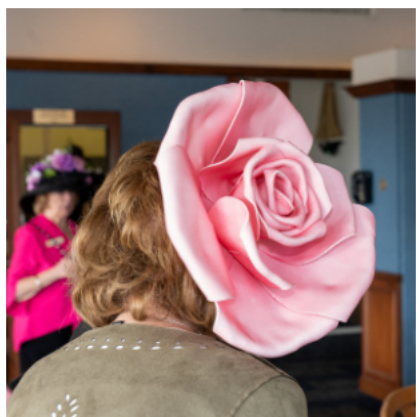

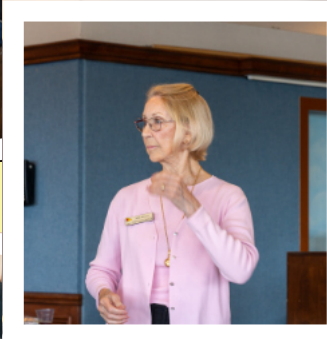

Tom and Anita Petersen are the proud owners of several boats and have indeed owned dozens of boats over the years. This profile is about Tug This. This stout and salty looking tugboat actually was a real tug in its prior life. Its mission was moving docks and small barges.

The boat has a LOA of 22 feet and an 8-foot beam. The Petersen's have been the caring owners of Tug This for the past five years. When the boat came up for sale Tom purchased the boat right away. After all, what boy who grew up on the water doesn't want to own a tugboat?



In its present life, Tug This serves as a standout harbor cruise boat. It caught my eye right away, and you will know when you see it. Tug This is powered by a Mercedes 90 HP diesel engine and its top speed is 5 knots.

It is also a well well-known and identifiable leader of harbor cruises. More on the harbor cruises later.

Any boat that has the profile and DNA should have an air horn commensurate with its stature. Tug This checks that box as well. Oh, and the tug has a massive air horn! Think Popeye!

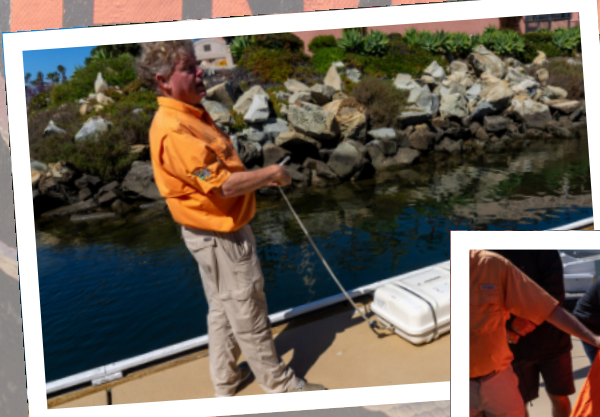

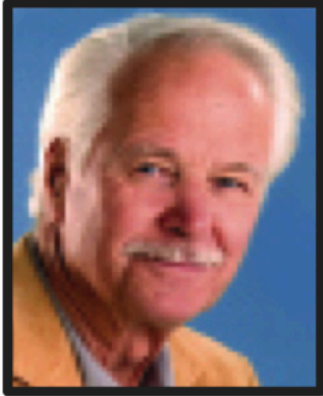
