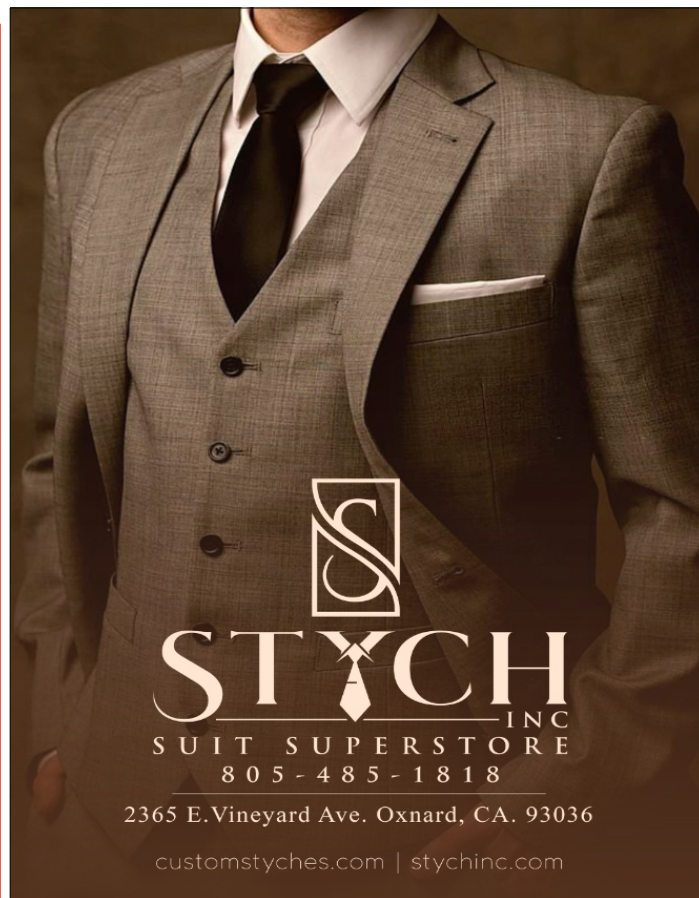

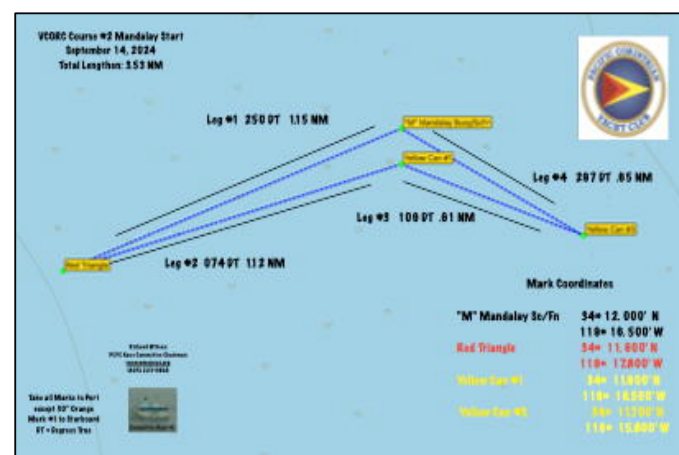
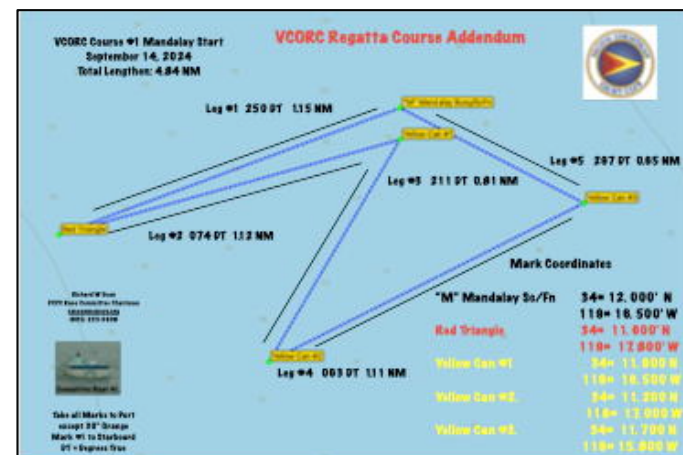
We offer formal Principal Race Officer (PRO) training through US Sailing. If you have ever wanted a taste of salt water racing, please

At the Quarterly General Membership Meeting on August 16, 2024, the membership approved the proposed amendments to:

Article 6 – Election of Member

6.4 Applications for membership shall be considered on a first-come-first-served basis by the Board of Directors at the next Regular Board Meeting, which is not sooner than ten (10) days following the aforesaid notification of members. Completed Applications and Agreements submitted by eligible persons shall be voted on by the Board of Directors when membership levels remain within established limits.

Article 9 – Meetings of the Membership

9.8 All membership notices and mailings required by these Bylaws may be sent by electronic notice (e-mail), or by posting to the password-protected website accessible only to Club members when a member has consented to receive such electronic notice. Any member may revoke their consent to receive electronic notice by providing written notice to the Secretary.

PCYC MEMBER BOAT PROFILE: ISLANDER

Islander is a 35-foot Duffy Downeast Lobster/Picnic boat, made by Atlantic Boat company in Brookline Maine. Islander is owned by longtime PCYC members Ron Dreher and his wife Natalie. These boats are ubiquitous in Maine and the northeast where they serve as commercial lobster boats and picnic boats.

In California these types are starting to show up. In fact, the Pacific Corinthian Marina has added three of this style boats this past year.

The hull has a commercial DNA, overbuilt, a large rudder and prop. The deep keel and skeg

protect the prop. As a picnic boat it is finished with teak and holly inside. A full galley, head/wet shower and sleeping quarters are down below.

Islander is powered by a CAT3208, she cruises at 15 knots. Her downeast hull with low center of gravity allows her to be underway comfortably at any speed.

The boat is perfect for coastal cruising, going out to the islands and having lunch. At 35 feet with a starboard helm door, she is easily single handed.

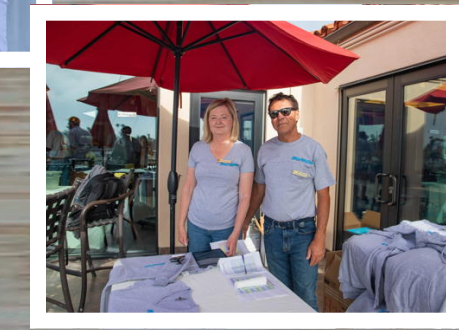
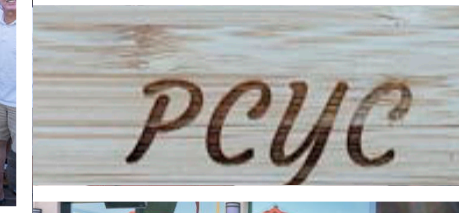
