Meaning of Periplus



The word “periplus” stems from meaning “journey” and also circumnavigation or sea voyage coastline. The use of a periplus, or journal, dates back to the second century and was a document listing, in order, the ports and coastal landmarks, with approximate intervening distances, that the captain of a vessel could expect to find along a shore. In that sense, the periplus was a type of log, similar to the modern day ship’s log.

We use the term for our newsletter since it is the documentation of our travels at the Club and offshore and provides a historical record for us to reminisce and share with others. It is our shared and unique history as Club members.

From the Desk of Fleet Captain Power and Electric

Three topics to bring to your attention this month:

1. DO YOU HAVE YOUR BOATER CARD?

If YOU operate a boat in California waters, everyone, regardless of age, must possess a California Boater Card as of January 1, 2025. The only exception is if the operator is renting the vessel, which includes PCYC's electric Duffy, Cutie, where a boater's card is NOT technically required. However, be prepared to be stopped and boarded by Channel Islands Harbor Patrol or the U.S. Coast Guard if you venture past the bridge and down the main channel toward the breakwater. Gray Whale Migration in the Santa Barbara Channel

PCYC is uniquely located at the mid-point of the Santa Barbara Channel. The Santa Barbara Channel is a prime location for witnessing one of nature's most extraordinary spectacles: the annual migration of gray whales (*Eschrichtius robustus*). This migration, one of the longest of any mammal, spans around 12,000 miles round trip, as these majestic creatures travel between their Arctic feeding grounds and the warm lagoons of Baja California, Mexico.



Santa Cruz Island and pass thru the Anacapa Passage. The peak southbound migration period in California is typically January.

Northbound Migration (February – May): After calving and nursing in Baja's lagoons, the whales return northward starting in February. Mothers with newborn calves are among the last to leave and often hug the coastline for safety, making them particularly visible from shore. In the

Santa Barbara Channel, this northbound migration reaches its peak from mid-February to mid-May. The apex predator orcas will at times try to ambush a calf. It is for this reason the whales hug the coast.

This year PCYC has two whale watching cruises planned, one in February and March.

Migration Timeline

Southbound Migration (November–February): Gray whales begin their journey south in late fall, leaving the icy waters of the Bering and Chukchi Seas. By late November through December, they pass through the Santa Barbara Channel on their way to Baja's lagoons, where they mate and give birth. They typically stay close to the north side of

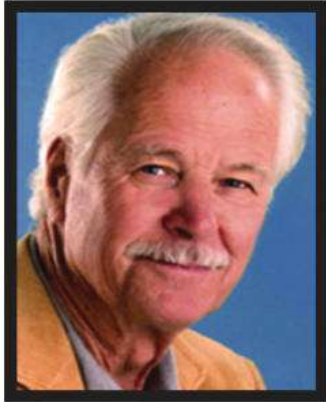
