Youth Sailing Program Off to a Strong Start!

Dear PCYC Members,

I am thrilled to share that our 2025 Summer Youth Sailing Program is off to a fantastic start! We have just completed Week 1 of our 10-week season, and all signs point to surpassing last year's enrollment—a testament to the growing enthusiasm for youth sailing within our community.

Thanks to the generous support of our members and donors, we continue to strengthen our program both in size and quality. A special thank you to the CSU Channel Islands Boating Center, which recently

donated some Laser Pico sailboats. These stable, responsive boats are ideal for teaching beginners and helping our younger sailors gain confidence on the water.

We are also proud to announce the purchase of a new 420 sailboat — a huge step forward for our intermediate and advanced training curriculum. For those unfamiliar, the 420 class is a two-person dinghy that introduces young sailors to the skills of spinnaker handling and trapeze use—essential techniques for competitive sailing and future keel-boat racing. The 420 allows us to provide high-level instruction and better prepare our sailors for regional regattas and beyond.

We were honored to have our Treasurer, Vanessa Belozeroff, share her passion and insight at the recent Ladies Who Do Lunch event, where she spoke about the impact our foundation has on local youth. A heartfelt thank you also goes to S/C Patty McInnes, one of the founders of PCYF, who also spoke on behalf of the foundation.

Our \$50,000 fundraising campaign to support scholarships, safety equipment, and fleet upgrades is well underway.

This summer is shaping up to be one of our best yet, and we could not do it without your support. Whether through donations, volunteering, or simply spreading the word, your involvement helps shape the next generation of sailors and stewards of the sea.

- July 17– 20 – Two Harbors, Catalina. Located on Catalina’s west end, Two Harbors is a mere 22 miles from the Southern California mainland. This rustic village sits on a narrow strip of land that separates Isthmus Cove on the leeward side of the island from Catalina Harbor on the windward side. Stay in Two Harbors or Catalina Harbor, your choice.

The year is flying by, and we're now entering the best time for boating! The water is warming up, and the wind has slowed down, creating ideal conditions.

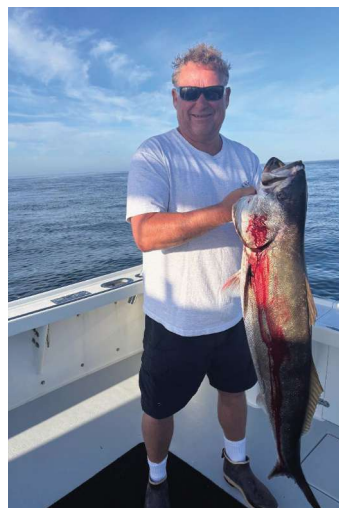
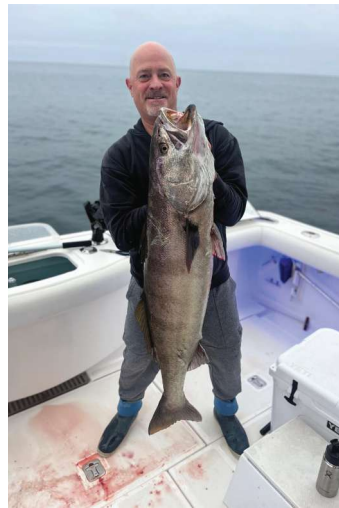

PCYC On-the-Water By Richard W Dean Desk of Fleet Captain Sail, Race Committee Chair

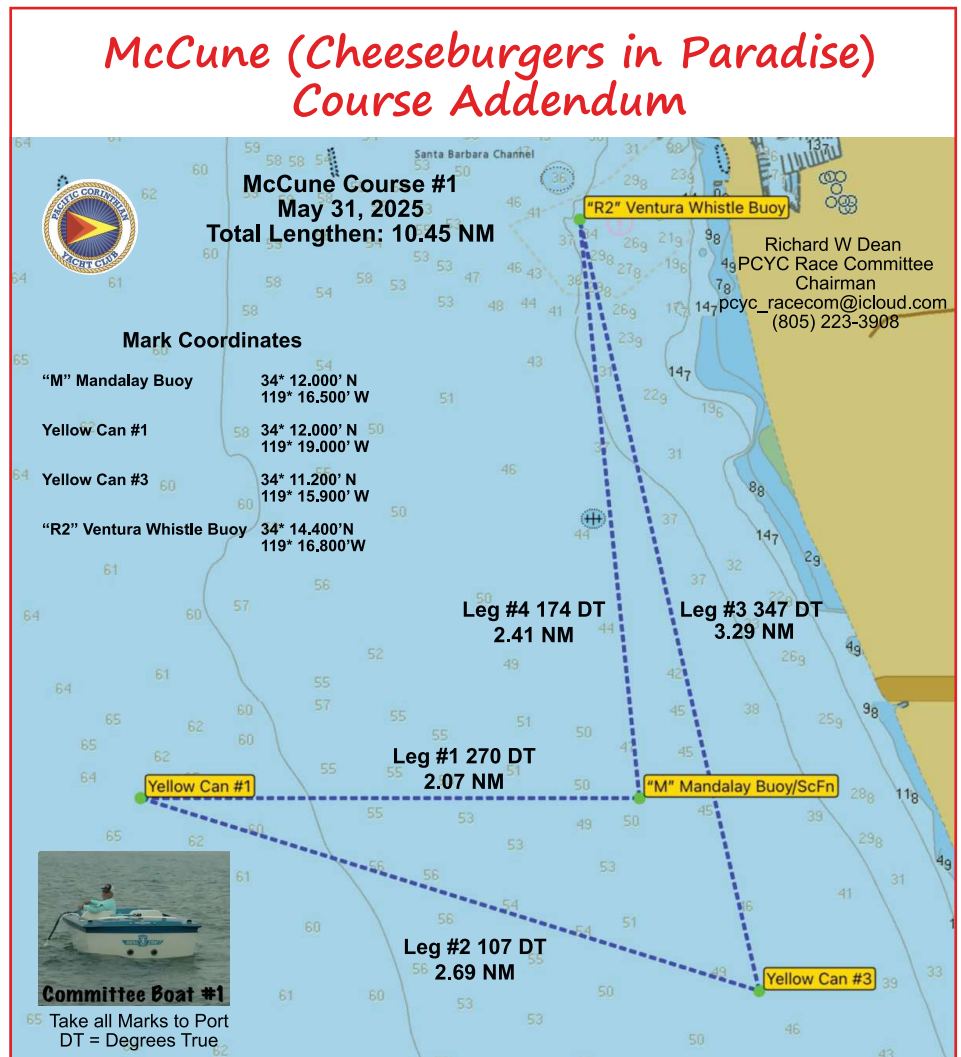
Those new to the Club, yachting, and particularly sail racing might ask, "What does a Race Committee do?" Well in this article, I will endeavor to explain some of the duties of a Race Committee. A YACHT CLUB should be all about the water, boats, water safety, navigation on the water, etc. - just like a golf club should be all about golfing. On the water, many types of water craft ply the waves. At PCYC, for example, we offer kayaks, paddle boards, an electric boat, sail boats, and training to use all these things. If you are a new or old member and are interested in any water craft that the Club owns, they are available for member use sometimes with instruction required. Please check with the Front Desk or this office for questions.

Now to the Race Committee (RC)! We all understand the concept of a "race". A Sail Race IS a race of course using sailboats and a crew's skills to sail a course in the most timely fashion. The sport of Sail Racing is governed by the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS), and one member of the RC is known as the Principal Race Officer (PRO). The PRO knows the RRS and is in charge of conducting the sail race. Our PRO for the McCune Race was Mark Slothower. The RC also has a "crew" to assist in conducting the race by Starting, Monitoring, Finishing, and recording the

results of the race as directed by the PRO. The rules of sail racing can be complicated and intimidating, but at PCYC our Sailing Program is designed to make racing fun, safe, and still competitive.

A first step in creating a race is defining the course of sail. On May 31, PCYC held its McCune Race, AKA Cheeseburgers In Paradise. The course of sail is shown below. A necessary

component of establishing the "course of sail" sometimes involves "setting a MARK". Shown on the Course Map are two Marks - Yellow Can 1 and 3. These two Marks must be dropped in the water at precise locations (coordinates) and anchored to the bottom. Below are pictures of these Marks being retrieved after the race. As you can see, these Marks are not small. Each stands about 8' tall and 6'



around, and they can be seen for over a mile on the water with the naked eye. The boat that “sets” the Marks and retrieves them is called a “Mark Set Boat”.

Next, the RC must be transported to the START location, in this case Mandalay Buoy positioned about 1.1 nautical miles westward into the Channel



between Ventura Harbor and Channel Islands Harbor. Once on location, the Committee Boat must set a START LINE which consists of an imaginary line between the “PIN” (Mandalay Buoy, below) and an



ORANGE FLAG flown from the anchored Committee Boat (above). The distance between the PIN and Orange Flag is defined in the RRS, and in our case was about 75-100 yards.

Our Committee Boat for the McCune Race was provided by PCYC Member Charles Jourdan. Pictured below is his 1973 - 38' Kettenburg.



Flamingo (below), owned by Matt Epstein, will serve as Committee Boat for this year's McNish Wooden Boat Classic on July 26, 2025.



The RC started the race at 1200 with eight boats under light winds — not the best wind conditions for optimum racing, but sailing is at the mercy of the weather. The RRS defines a specific sequence of flags and sounds during a five minute starting



sequence. Members of the RC conduct the sequence.

Pictured above are members of the RC. Mark Slothower is PCYC's Race Committee Co-Chair. He is pictured here on the left together with RC Member Bernard Kummer. Others on the RC are the Skipper of the Committee Boat (middle photo). Pictured left is Skipper Jourdan and to his right is David Vadbunker, another Skipper of both his own boat and Sea Scouts Ship 9201. Dave also doubles as a locksmith with Action Locksmiths, (805) 414-5898 in case you need a smithy.

Lastly, every race needs to be documented. Our RC Photographer, Dwight McCann, pictured far

right, does awesome work for the Club and the RC.

Once the McCune Race is STARTED, the RC sits at anchor until all boats have finished through the Finish Gate. The last boat in the McCune Race finished at 15:30:40 leaving about three hours for lunch and shooting the breeze. Box lunches were prepared by PCYC Kitchen Staff (Thank YOU). After another 30 minutes retrieving the two Marks, we were bound for the Club and the award ceremony afterwards. THE RACE COMMITTEE IS ALWAYS LOOKING FOR ADDITIONAL CREW! ASK THE FRONT DESK.

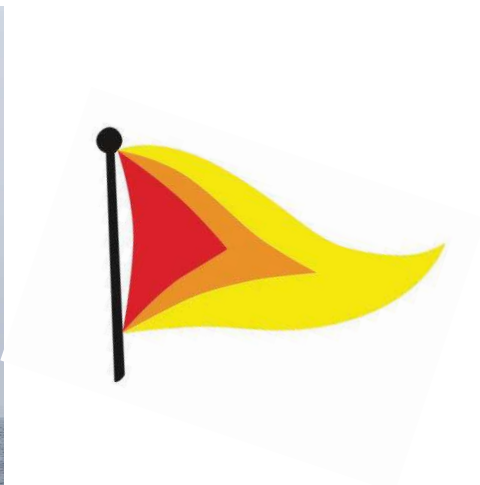

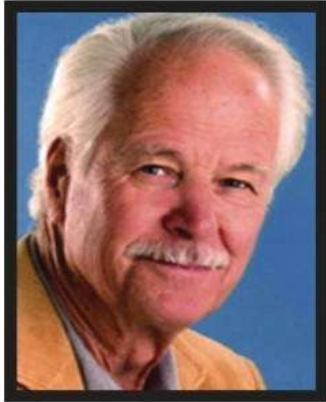
