Dear Fellow Club Members:

April-May is a good time to sail in British Virgin Islands, and we rented a boat from Conch Charters <https://conchcharters.com/> to go island hopping for 10 days. This is the second time we went as a family, this time on a sailing catamaran, and I wanted to share our wonderful journey.

First, about travel. Although a personal preference, the British side is more attractive by being less crowded, cleaner as it seems, and having more variety of harbors and islands compared to the U.S. side. That comes at the expense of a more complicated travel, which is best approached by connecting via Puerto Rico on major airlines and using a local airline for the Tortola connection. If you book a sleep-aboard the day before the start of the charter, you will be rested for orientation and provisioning. Then, with 10 days ahead of you, and over 30 little islands inside a two-hour trip from each other and plenty of mooring balls, the sky is the limit – you decide what you want – more time at sea or more time at the harbors. Both are great, and you can decide the morning you wake up. Oh, and these days you can order all your groceries on-line for delivery on the boat. Not bad, huh. . .

We started with Norman Island and its famous Willy T's (it is a bar, and, yes, you jump in the water from the top deck), then went to Cooper Island with its spectacular snorkeling and the world famous rum bar, then to Virgin Gorda to hang out at the Bitter End Yacht Club, then to Marina Key and Scrub Island Resort and, finally, to Jost Van Dyke, where we had lunch at Foxy's and had a chat with Mr. Fox, the musician and the owner himself.

Our boat was a 40-foot catamaran Leopard that exceeded expectations – this newer version featured an open saloon deck and galley and three

cabin/two head layout below. The comfort level was amazing, almost like being in a hotel, even to the espresso machine detail. We spent more time in the water than outside, and it felt wonderful. Kids became proficient dinghy drivers – we even beached the dinghy one time at the Sandy Cay. That was an adventure . . . As was driving the boat over a mooring ball, but that is a separate story altogether . . .

We cannot wait to go back. If you are interested in learning more, please let me know, and I will share details.

While on a cruise almost 20 years ago, I had a conversation with the Cruise Director and mentioned how I wished the whales and other wonderful animals in the sea could know what love and good wishes we humans felt for them. A few days later she sent the following email. I kept a copy of that email, lost it, recently found it again, and want to share it with you.

“Gratitude”

“If you read the front page story of the SF Chronicle on Thursday, Dec. 14, 2005, you would have read about a female humpback whale who had become entangled in a spider web of crab traps and lines. She was weighted down by hundreds of yards of line rope wrapped around her body – her tail, her torso, a line tugging in her mouth.

“A fisherman spotted her just east of the Farallon Islands (outside the Golden Gate) and radioed an environmental group for help. Within a few hours,

the rescue team arrived and determined that she was so bad off, the only way to save her was to dive in and untangle her – a very dangerous proposition. One slap of the tail could kill a rescuer.

“They worked for hours with curved knives and eventually freed her. When she was free, the divers say she swam in what seemed like joyous circles. She then came back to each and every diver, one at a time, and nudged them, pushed them gently around – she thanked them.

“Some said it was the most incredibly beautiful experience of their lives. The guy who cut the rope out of her mouth says her eye was following him the whole time, and he will never be the same.

“May you, and all those you love, be so blessed and fortunate – to be surrounded by people who will help you get untangled from the things that are binding you. And, may you always know the joy of giving and receiving gratitude.”

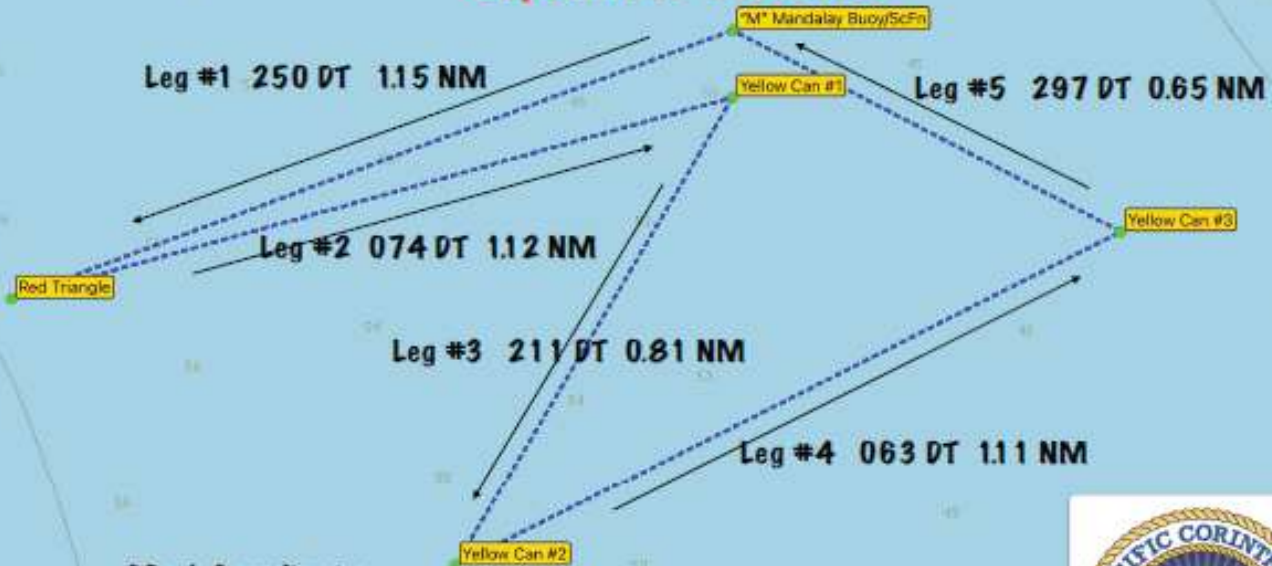
Here (see page 7) are the courses to be sailed in the VCORC Regatta. These courses were used in last year's race, and everyone loved them - short and sweet - lots of fun.

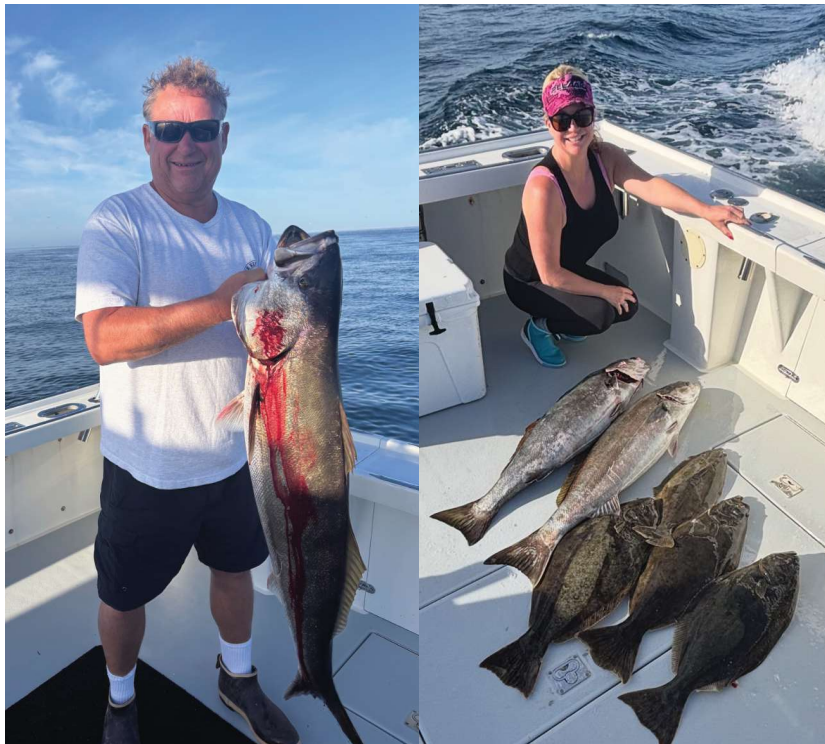
PCYC Summer Slam Fishing Tournament 2025

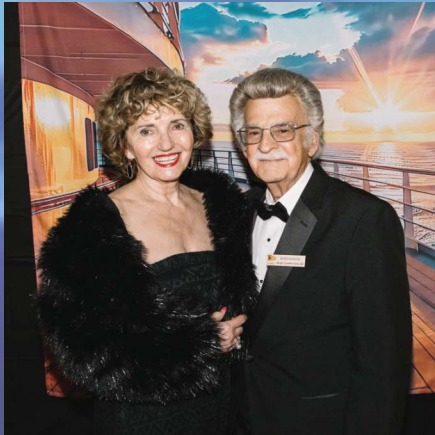

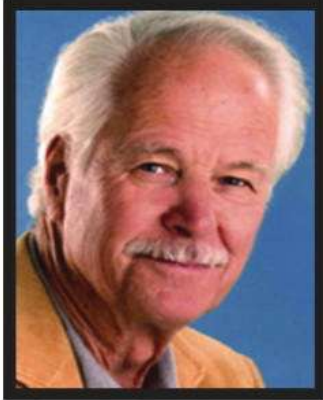
