

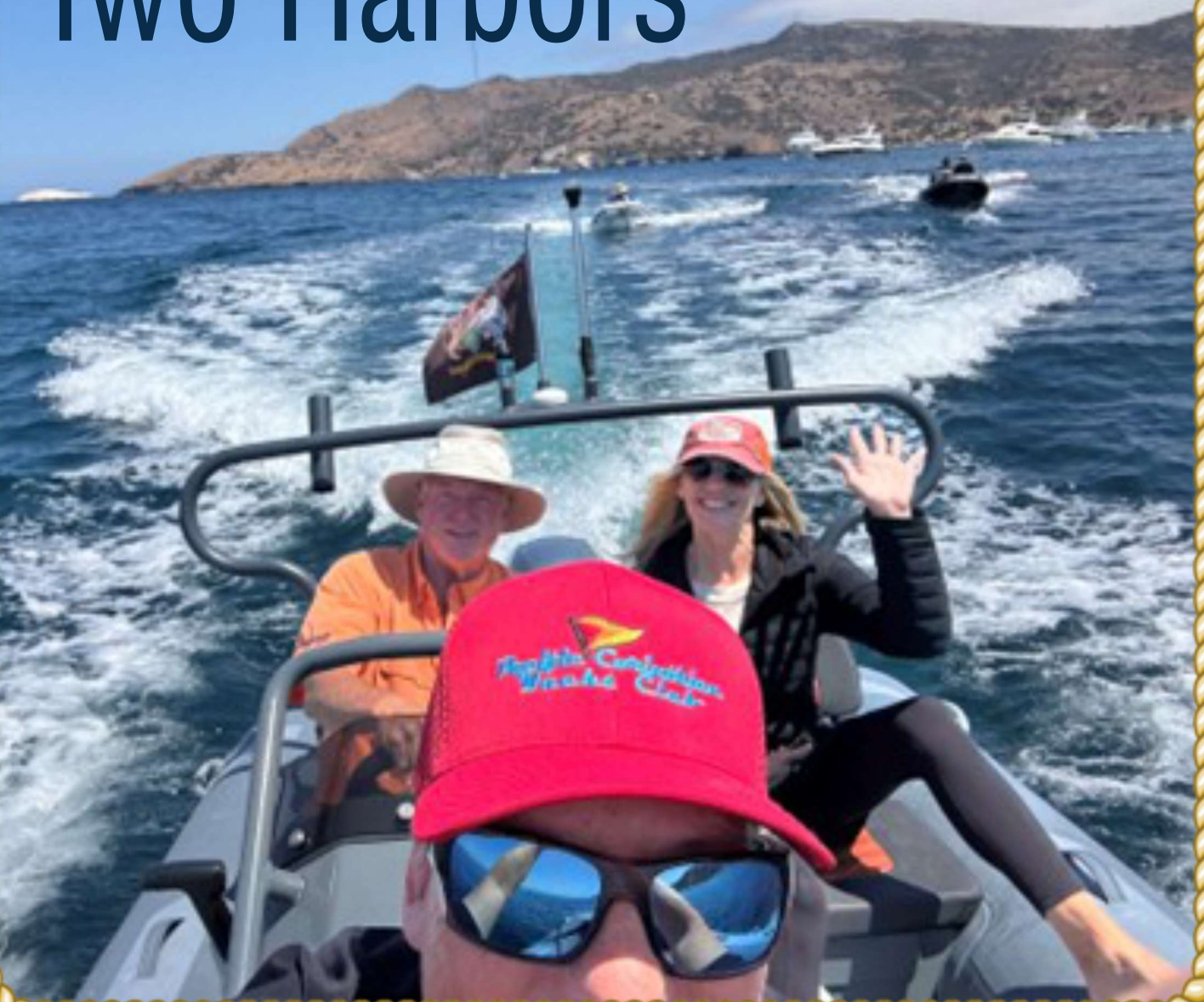

YACHTING PROTOCOL – CLUB RECIPROCITY JOHN GADDIS - STAFF COMMODORE

Throughout Pacific Corinthian Yacht Club’s history, many members have shared their wisdom and tried to educate members on various topics of yachting protocol. This month I’d like to share what little knowledge I have to address one of the major perks in joining PCYC, club reciprocity.

Reciprocity allows members of PCYC the opportunity to visit and to use the facilities of another yacht club, and usually grants our members access to the reciprocal club’s dining rooms, lounges, boat docking, and other boating-related services.

PCYC shares reciprocity with most of the yacht clubs on the West Coast and throughout the country. A good place to find a reciprocal club listing is on the Southern California Yachting Association (scya.org) website. However, should you be traveling outside the area, you can find many great yacht clubs listed in the Register of American Yacht Clubs. (ycaol.com)

It is essential for PCYC members to contact the host club in advance and to follow their specific policies and procedures for reciprocal visits. Like PCYC, the club may have limitations on the duration of your visits, the number of visits per year, or the specific facilities available to reciprocal guests.

Most yacht clubs require you to show your current membership card when visiting. However, if you have a specific club in mind, you ask the General Manager or the Front Desk to send a letter of introduction on your behalf which confirms you are a member in good standing of PCYC and are eligible to be granted guest privileges. Yacht clubs have varying agreements with different reciprocal clubs, so it's crucial to clarify the details with the

specific club being visited.

Also, if you are the first member from our club to visit a particular yacht club, you can have the honor of initiating a burgee exchange and establishing

reciprocity with the club. Ask the General Manager for a PCYC burgee to exchange before you leave. Make sure you take photos of the actual exchange and give the pictures to the Front Desk and our General Manager

upon your return. The tradition of a burgee exchange is sure to make for a memorable experience

Reciprocity extends to yacht clubs from just down the coast to around the world, fostering connections and friendships that extend throughout years and across oceans. Traditional yachting protocol, courtesy, and a thank you goes a long way in fostering good relationships between clubs.

Is it worth joining PCYC just for the reciprocity? Although it certainly wouldn’t be the only reason, the ability to access other private yacht clubs certainly holds great appeal.

From the Desk of Fleet Captain Sail, Race Committee Chair

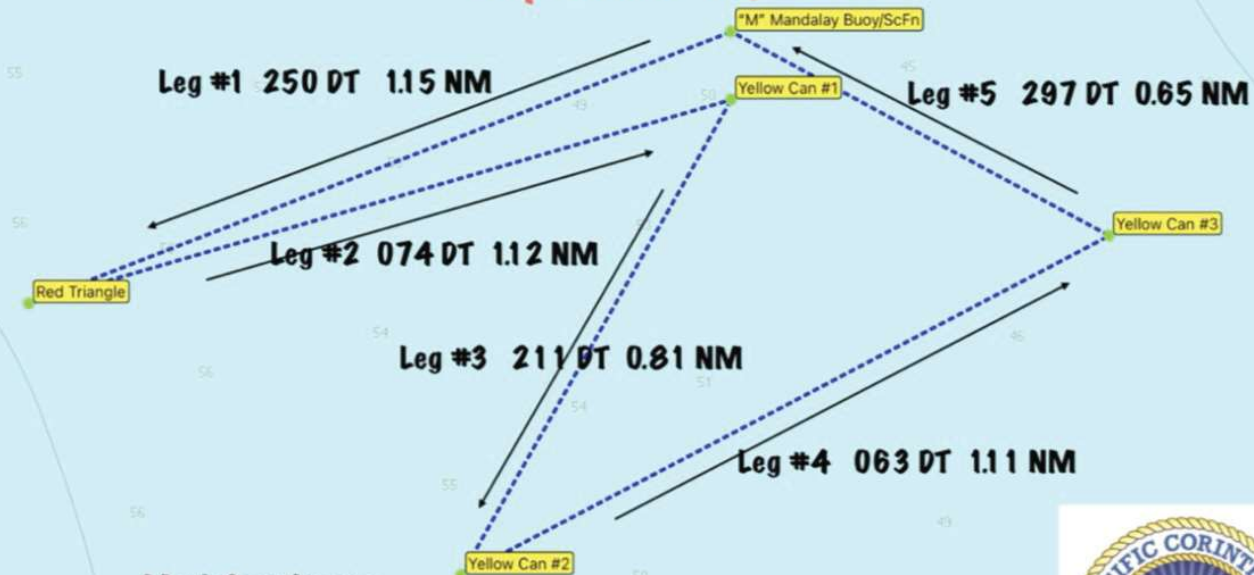
The course chart shown (next page) is PCYC's only regatta consisting of two races in one day. For this race series, we drop four marks removing one to change the course design. The longest course is only 4.84 nautical miles, and participant boats must complete both courses to qualify. VCORC is of course an acronym for Ventura County Off-Shore

Racing Circuit, and this race has been run for many years at PCYC. This particular race course is designed to provide looks at the wind from multiple angles while favoring boats that benefit from short runs. Last year, we had 10 boats, and this year we are hoping for a similar number.

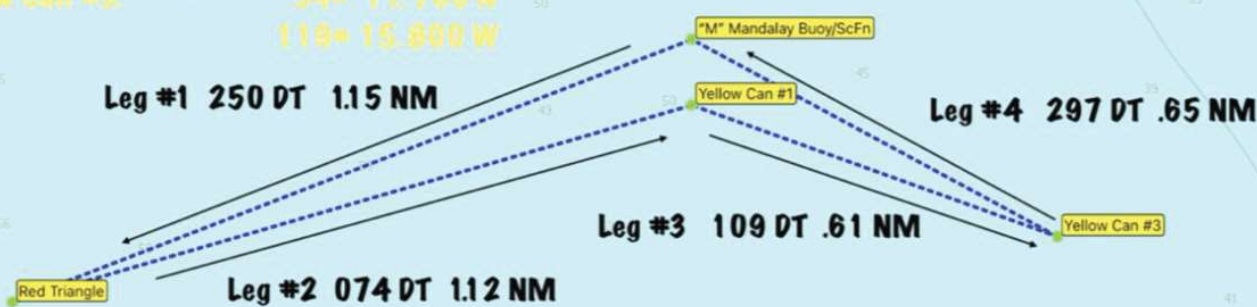
