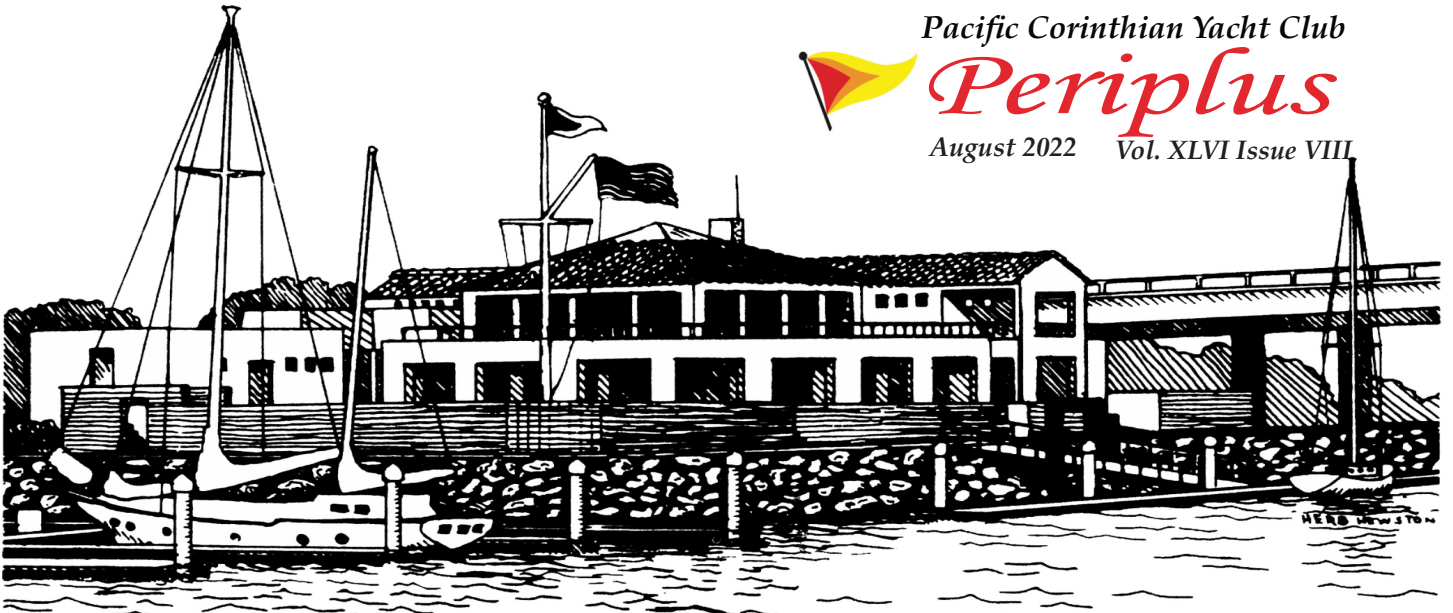

I certainly hope everyone at the Club had a wonderful 4th Of July celebrating in many ways as my family did, by also celebrating the completion of the Upper Deck Project.

Yes, the Upper Deck Project consisting of the of the tile flooring, the curb high lighting, the revised drainage system as well as the sealing of several doors and window areas on the upper deck was completed that very morning and immediately opened for member dining.

It was obvious to all, that a resumption of the enjoyment of outdoor dining and socializing among Members had returned. Also returning was the Dining of families and access to our spectacular live Panoramic View of the Channel.

Our Glass Wind Deflecting System installation was unfortunately delayed because of some recent, and now common, Sea Port delays and will assuredly be completed shortly.

In addition to the Upper Deck Project, the House Committee became aware of some difficulties with water treatment in our Swimming Pool and Spa. It was decided to immediately revise some of the water filtering and plumbing and modify the air deflection of the filter to provide the proper temperatures on a very consistent and steady basis. These changes also insure us the consistency for the high quality of water. In addition, after much concentration, some changes will also be made as to the pool maintenance professionals and it's scheduling.

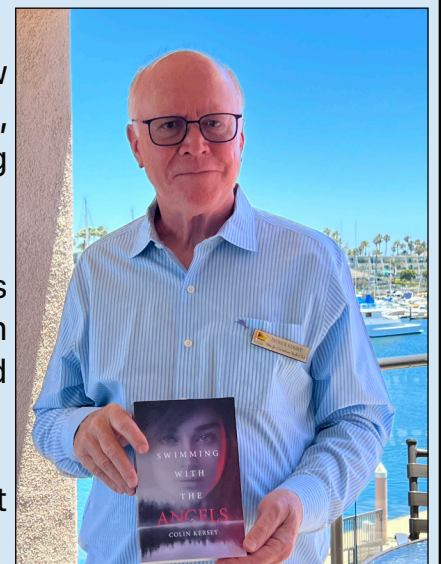
The House Committee continues to be meeting monthly and reviewing all aspects of our Club House and its surrounding area and looks forward to any Member comments or suggestions.

Profile of the Channel Islands National Park- Santa Cruz Island

Last month I provided an overview of the Channel Islands National Park (CINP) with a focus on Anacapa Island. This month a look at Santa Cruz Island (SCI) with an emphasis on the eastern part of the island.



Santa Cruz Island is the largest of the five islands that make up CINP and the largest in California. The island is twenty miles long and two to six miles wide. Seventy six percent of the island is owned by the Nature Conservancy. The eastern end of the island is owned by the National Park and is the closest to Channel Islands Harbor (CIH) at nineteen miles. Active Captain shows ten anchorages for all of SCI. The Nature Conservancy owns parts of the western part of the island. It is a nonprofit. Landing rights are controlled, be sure to get a permit.

The island's rich history, geography, and historic buildings make for a diversity of interesting anchorages and island hikes. The Chumash people lived on the island going back at least nine thousand years.

Some of the oldest human remains were found on Santa Rosa Island at over thirteen thousand years old. There were an estimated eleven Chumash villages on SCI. The Chumash had villages beyond, from San Luis Obispo to Malibu. The name Chumash roughly translates to maker of the shell bead money, which was done on SCI.

The Europeans came to SCI in 1542 when Juan Rodriquez Cabrillo first landed on the island. Cabrillo is thought to have died on one the islands in 1543 and is possibly buried in neighboring San Miguel Island. Ranching began on the island in the 1860s. Historical buildings from that era remain. Scorpion anchorage being the closest for that purpose to CIH.



The island's coastline is varied. Its marine terraces are characterized by steep cliffs. It has sea caves, sand and rock beaches. There is a major fault that runs thru SCI. Painted Cave is one of the largest sea caves in the world. The Island Packer Boats out of Ventura can fit inside the one hundred foot wide entrance. The cave goes one quarter of a mile into the island. It is best to visit the cave absent any ocean surge. The island's coves and caves have been used over the years by fur hunters, fishermen and contraband traders.

Another fun fact, Pygmy Mammoths were once on SCI.

Yellow Banks/Smugglers Anchorage:

Yellow banks prominent exposed sandstone is easily seen from CIH. PCYC has done several over night cruises to Yellow Banks. There is good protection from westerlies and a sand bottom. Not so good in a southern swell or Santa Ana. Be very careful if trying to go ashore as there is break on the beach. Many a dinghy has capsized making the attempted beach landing.

Scorpion/Little Scorpion:



Scorpion is a major public landing for the island Packers boats. Campers and day trippers are dropped off onto the pier. One can hike from Scorpion to Yellow Banks and the overlook to Potato Harbor.

There are several buildings ashore that are vestiges of the ranching days on the island. Be forewarned that the SCI Ravens make a nice living skillfully opening unguarded day trippers

back packs. I know from experience! Keep an eye out for the Island Fox, a unique species found on the Channel Islands. They are smaller than their main land cousins.

Potato Harbor:

Just to the west of Scorpion is Potato Harbor. It is a relatively narrow anchorage protected by steep walled cliffs on three sides. It has good protection from the prevailing winds. It is one of my favorite anchorages. Sail Channel Islands calls it one of the most picturesque anchorages in Channel Islands. It is said to offer good protection in a Santa Ana.

We hope you have had the opportunity to enjoy seeing our students on the water.

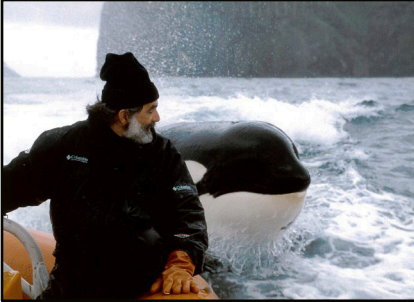

Presents Charles Vinick on August 17**



Oxnard, CA: The Channel Islands Maritime Museum (CIMM) is pleased to announce that Charles Vinick, the Executive Director of The Whale Sanctuary Project, will be its featured speaker in August. Mr. Vinick will speak about the Project and its work to establish a coastal sanctuary where cetaceans (whales and dolphins) can live in an environment that maximizes well-being and autonomy and is as close as possible to their natural habitat.

A member of the Whale Sanctuary Project Board of Directors since 2016, Mr. Vinick brings a unique blend of leadership and experience to the Project. For 25 years, he worked closely with Jean-Michel and Jacques Cousteau (during his lifetime), helping the ocean explorers establish, grow and sustain multiple initiatives. Mr. Vinick shepherded the growth of the Cousteau Society and, from 1993 through 2003 and served as Executive

The award-winning short film "Whales Without Walls" which was co-directed by Mr. Vinick will also be shown.

The CIMM Speaker Series will be presented on August 17, 2022. Doors open at 6:30 pm with the program beginning at 7:00 pm. Ticket Prices are \$7 for adults, \$5.00 for seniors and active military, \$3.00 for youths aged 6-17 years. Museum members receive free entrance to the event. 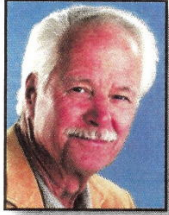

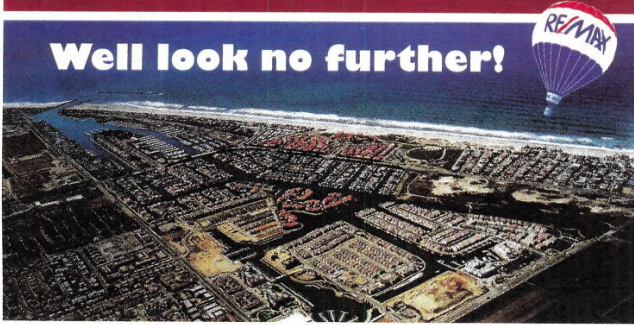
