## PROFILE OF THE CHANNEL ISLANDS NATIONAL PARK- ANACAPA ISLAND

The Channel Islands National Park (CINP) is located just beyond the harbor break water. The closest point (Arch Rock) to our yacht club is a mere 13.9 nm. It is one of sixty-three National Parks. The park encompasses five unique islands. From east to west, Santa Barbara, Anacapa, Santa Cruz, Santa Rosa, and San Miguel islands. There are over 2000 plant and animal species of which over 145 are found only in CINP. The islands and its unique isolation are called the Galapagos of North America. Did you know the Santa Barbara channel is considered one of the best places on earth to see whales? The Blue Whale is the largest animal on earth. It summers in the waters of our CINP. The transitory apex predator Killer whale comes thru the park waters too. Chumash lived on the islands more than 13,000 years ago. The islands are a glimpse of what California used to be.

In this essay, a focus on the closest island, Anacapa.

For PCYC boaters it's an easy day trip to Anacapa island. Arch rock makes a great background to photograph guests on board. Think of Arch Rock as a welcome photo bomb to your friends Anacapa island photo. The arch is the symbol of CINP. The island is a craggy and volcanic island that is three distinct islands. East island (the landing), mid island (Frenchy's cove), and west Anacapa. There are only two places to embark on to the island. The landing and Frenchy's Cove.

The landing is a bit tricky for recreational boaters. One would need to drop the hook, and take a dinghy into the landing, secure the dinghy, and climb the 157 stairs to the top of the island. There can be a very big surge depending on swell direction along with strong currents. I would keep an anchor watch onboard the boat. It is easier to go onto the island landing via Island Packers. The views from the marine terrace are breathtaking. When you get to the top there are picnic grounds, camp sites and a two-mile hiking trail. In the spring, the island is in full bloom with wildflowers. The western gull nests and chicks are everywhere. The most prominent feature is, of course, the light house. The light house was the last one built in the United States in 1933. It was built due to the wreck of the Winfield Scott which struck the middle island in dense fog on December 1, 1853. There was no loss of life, but passengers camped on the beach. They were picked up a week later by a rescue team.

Frenchy's cove is a wonderful anchorage to drop the hook for lunch. It is well protected from the prevailing wind. One can go ashore via dinghy and explore the small beach. Its easy to cross to the other side of the island and explore the tide pools. December and January are best to explore the tide pools due to the king tides. The name Frenchy's cove is named after a hermit Raymond LeDreau who lived in the cove for three decades.

Western Anacapa is off limits to visitors. It is the breeding ground for endangered California brown pelicans. Having been out there many times I don't think one could even get on the western island as the cliffs are so very steep.

There are club trips to the island of Anacapa. Landlubbers are welcome. Last month's Anacapa trip was postponed due to weather. Be sure to monitor the club email for announcements. Also, the club cruising schedule can be found on the web site. I have it on good word from our Cruise Chair Scott Von Lanken that a cruise to Anacapa could be in the offing for August 20th!

Get out to see Anacapa. Go boating.

**MCCUNE CHEESEBURGERS IN PARADISE RACE AND PARTY**

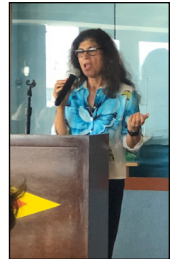

This time of year, we still have a lot of white sea bass and halibut in the area. We can start adding swordfish, yellowtail and, hopefully, tuna.

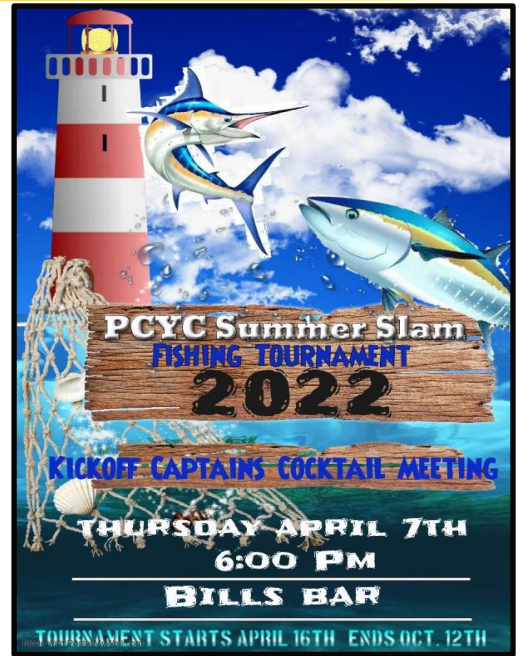

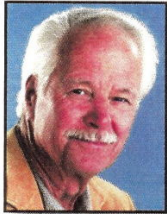

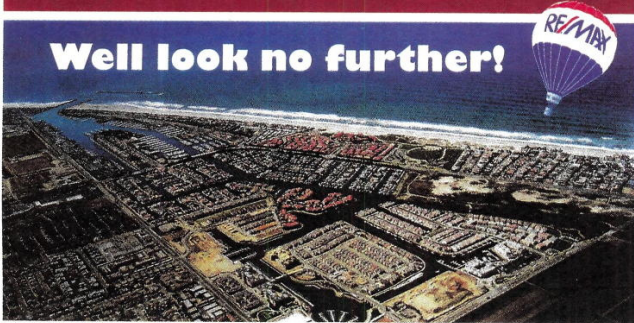
