## Meaning of Periplus

The word periplus stems from Greek, meaning 'journey' and also means a circumnavigation or sea voyage around a coastline. The use of a periplus, or journal, dates back to the second century and was a document listing in order, the ports and coastal landmarks, with approximate intervening distances, that the captain of a vessel could expect to find along a shore. In that sense the periplus was a type of log, similar to the modern day ship's log.

We use the term for our Club newsletter since it is the documentation of our travels at the Club and offshore and provides a historical record for us to reminisce and share with others. It is our shared and unique history as club members.

## SUMMER SLAM 2022

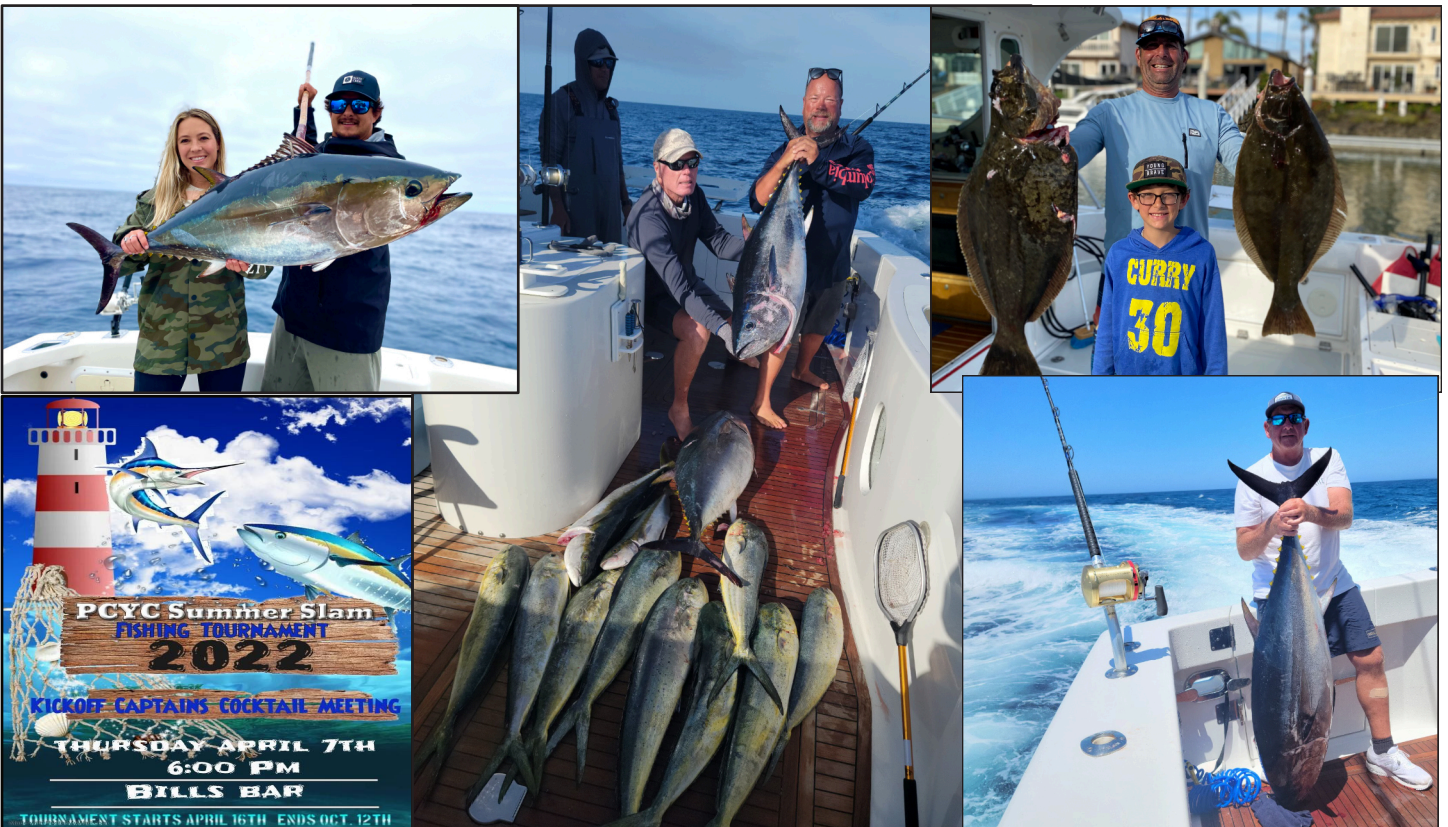
Hello fellow anglers-

I am writing this on a big day. It is August 14 and today was our awards banquet held in the PCYC Main Dining Room. A total of 126 students and relatives were present. The Italian buffet was excellent and the awards presentation coordinated and made by Head Instructor Sienna Patterson went well.



Over one hundred students went through the four two-week sessions. Some took more than one session. We had to reduce the size of Session 4 because some instructors had to leave to go back to school or take time for family vacations.

It is amazing how quickly these kids pick up sailing skills. There was lots of enthusiasm and parental involvement this year. We know we shall see many of the sailors back in 2023.



Now we have the job of making any necessary repairs and restoring the boats in the racks. Then there is the maintaining of the outboard motors and preparing them for storage. ## Profile of the Channel Islands National Park- Santa Rosa Island

This month's short article is about Santa Rosa Island. Santa Rosa Island is approximately 6 miles to the west of SCI. The island is 54,000 acres and is the second largest island in Channel Islands National Park. There are sixty-two miles of shoreline. It is characterized by high mountains (Soledad Peak is 1,574 feet), marine terraces, scenic canyons. It has 15 or so perennial creeks. The island is roughly 50 miles from Channel Islands Harbor. As one cruises west in the Santa Barbara Channel the weather (WX) can get more challenging. Boaters should pay special attention to the forecast when heading to the western most islands. It is not uncommon for thirty knots of wind. Fog is also present. Hazardous WX can and does come up at any time.

### Getting to the Island:

The only way to get to SRI is by boat. Many PCYC boaters, mostly fisherman, make it out to Rosa as it is called on the docks. Fishing pressure is greatly reduced at the outer islands and those who make the effort are rewarded. If you don't have a boat, Island Packers out of Ventura also offers trips to SRI. Island Packers is a great way to embark upon the island for hiking and camping. It is a two-to-three-hour trip via Island Packers, depending on WX and sea state. Island Packers web site advises to be prepared for rough seas. Visitors who plan on hiking should be in good physical condition. This island is very remote. Up until last year one could fly to SRI via Channel Islands Aviation. Unfortunately, that service is no longer available.

### Archeology/History:

SRI has had a colorful and diversified history. The island has an estimated two to three thousand archeological sites. Arlington Canyon is the site where archeologist found the oldest human remains in North America. Arlington man is estimated to have lived over thirteen thousand years ago. Pygmy mammoth remains were uncovered in 1994. It is the most complete specimen ever found. The oldest specimen is dated at eighty thousand years old!! You can visit the remains of that long ago pygmy mammoth at the Channel Islands Visitor site.

The Chumash inhabited the island until they were removed to the mainland in 1817. Various ranching operations were on the island. Much of the native vegetation was destroyed by over grazing sheep. In WW II the island was taken over by the US Navy and used as a bombing range. The island became part of Channel Islands National Park in 1986. Much time and effort has been spent restoring the native habitat and ecosystem.

### Plants and Animals:



The island supports five hundred different plant species. Six plants species are found only on Santa Rosa and nowhere else in the world.

A Torrey pine species is only found on Santa Rosa. This tree was widespread in the ice age. A similar species of Torrey pines is found in San Diego, both are considered relic species. Another relic species is the island oak tree.

Of course, the island is home to various pinnipeds and serves as a breeding ground for the once nearly extinct Elephant Seal.

## **Geology**

The coast along the Santa Barbara Channel and Islands runs east and West. The rest of coastal California runs North and South. There is evidence that the islands and our coast rotated 85 degrees from its original position!

Many of the rocks on Santa Rosa and San Miguel match the rocks found in San Diego. Geologists tell us this occurred 18 million years ago as the Pacific Plate slid past the North American plate. The plate tectonics unleashed floods of volcanic lava. The islands continue to rotate and in fact get closer to the mainland by 6mm per year. Yes, each year you are saving fuel in getting to the islands!

## **Historical Buildings:**

Ranch buildings from the Vail and Vickers Company are still on the island. The ranch had both sheep and cattle. At its peak the ranch had nine thousand cattle. The cattle were transported to and from the island aboard the boat Vaquero out of Santa Barbara. Cattle were off loaded for auction at Port Hueneme. Vail and Vickers operated for nearly one hundred years. Santa Rosa was brought into the CINP in 1980 and purchased for \$30M. The last cattle were brought ashore in 1998.



There was also a commercial hunting operation on the island. One could pay to hunt nonnative pigs, deer and elk. The hunting operation was another income stream for the ranch. The hunting operation continued until 2011.

## **Things to do:**

The island offers visitors varied and spectacular hiking. Wildflower viewing in the spring, kayaking, snorkeling, camping and of course excellent fishing. Visitors should be prepared to support themselves on the island and be ready for wind.

The resident park ranger told me of a wind event that forced all the campers to shelter in the rest rooms as the wind blew the tents down!

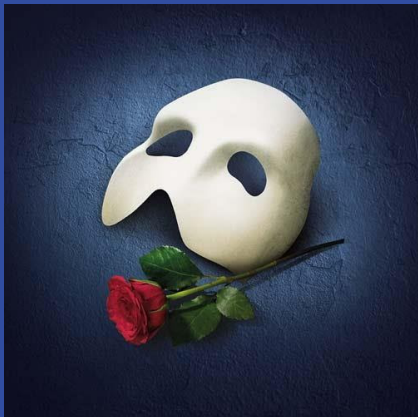

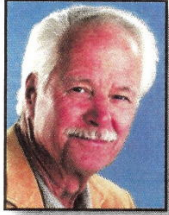

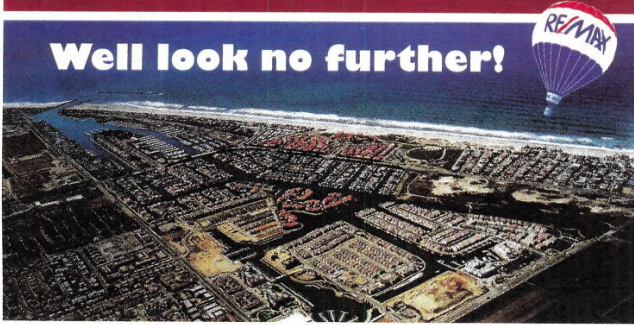
