I would like to take this opportunity to wish everyone a happy and prosperous new year. It is hard to believe we are already in 2019!

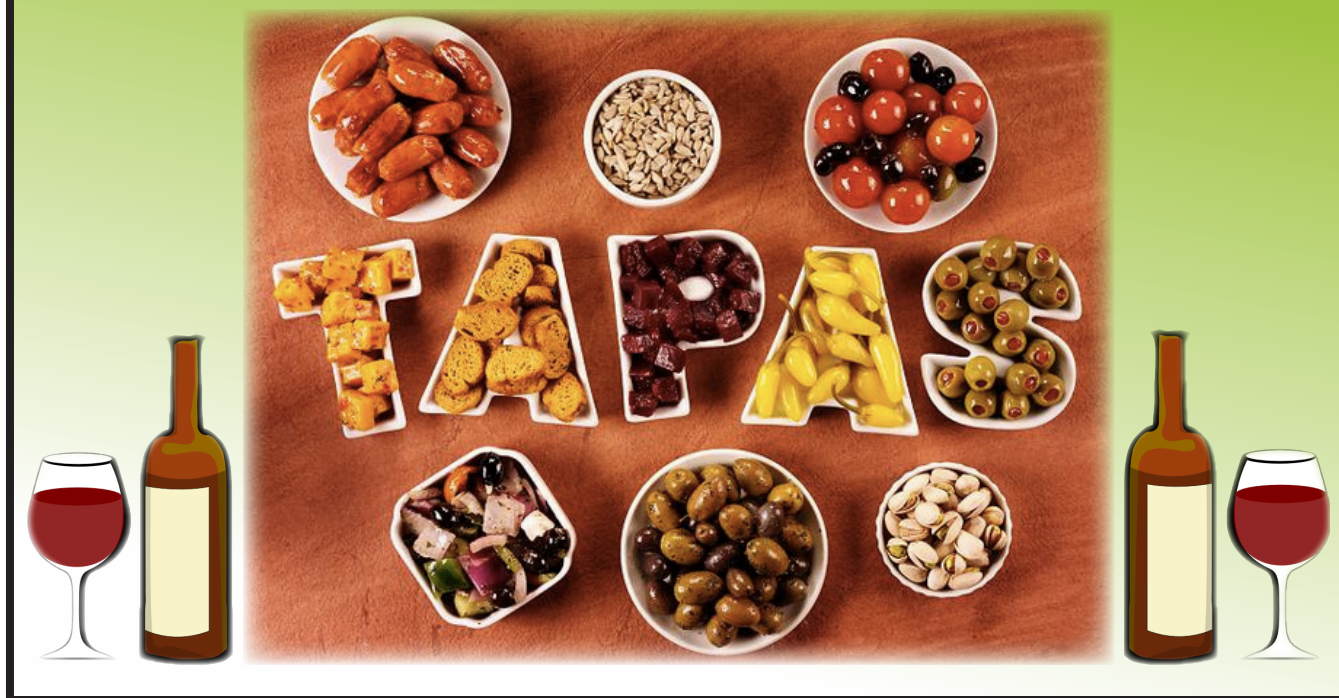

After serving on the Pacific Corinthian Youth Foundation Board of Directors for 10 years, three of them as Secretary, three of them as Vice President, and three of them as President, I have decided to step down from serving as President this coming year. Our Board has selected Tom Shideler as Pacific Corinthian Youth Foundation President this coming year.

Stepping down was a very difficult decision for me because I love our mission, because it is very enjoyable working with such outstanding Board Members, and because of the outstanding support of the Youth Foundation by our Club members. However, after 10 years it is time for a change, and Tom Shideler brings new vision and new enthusiasm to our program. Also, we are very fortunate to have Rick Eberst joining us as a Director this year as well as Jane Thomas, who is the Commodore of the Channel Islands Women's

Sailing Association.

I am very proud of our accomplishments over the last 10 years. During that time we have taught over 1,500 kids to sail, and more than 25% of them were kids we put through on scholarships because their parents did not have ability to pay. Because the support of our Club members we have acquired six new Sabot and six new Optimist training boats. Because of your generous donations we have also outfitted and registered six instructor boats. We have purged the storage yard of obsolete inventory and cleaned it up. Through no small effort our inventory is up-to-date, and all of our equipment is insured and registered with the DMV.

I would like to thank all of the Board Members who have served with me over the past 10 years for their outstanding service to our organization. In particular, I would like to thank John Gaddis for service on our Board for almost as long as mine and for his outstanding work in obtaining grants and his work with the California Department of Boating and Waterways. Also, Lynda Radke's assistance as Treasurer has been particularly valuable in keeping us on a strong financial footing.

Over the last 10 years we faced many challenges. We overcame them all. Our new Board will face future challenges which, with the continued support of our Club members, will be overcome as well. Again, thank you all for your support during my terms of office, and thank you for your continuing support of our youth sailing program.

I am proud and excited to announce the establishment of Sea Scout Ship 9201 as part of the Pacific Corinthian Youth Foundation. Our Club, and PCYF, has a history of support for youth sailing. Now the Sea Scouts add an option for youth to grow well beyond the summer sailing program. To join Sea Scouts, a youth must be 14 years old, or 13 years old and graduated from the eighth grade; they may stay until 21 years of age. Activities are in, on, under and around the water and provide challenging rank advancement, safe boat training, and marine education. The program will offer a viable path to careers in the marine and maritime industry, and impart important knowledge onto these future custodians of our coastline and marine environment. At the very least, the program teaches boating skills for future recreational boaters and many worthwhile life skills.

“Ship 9201” is valuable community outreach to youth and would not be possible without the support of our Club members. In particular, I want to recognize PCYC member and PCYF president Jack Schuler for his support, and thank PCYC member David Wolf and Skipper Jon Conner for helping to get the new program off the ground. In addition, an anonymous donor has paid first year charter costs.

Learning from the past, the program will not include owning a large boat with high cost and risk but will maximize use of existing assets usually in storage nine months of the year. Also planned is to draw in the immense talent and knowledge in our yacht club community.
