Vice Commodore's Report - John Gaddis



Of all of the wonderful opportunities PCYC has to offer, the Pacific Corinthian Youth Foundation is one of the best by far. Many PCYC members have fond memories of their children and grandchildren learning how to sail in those “little boats” in the harbor. The PCYF Summer Sailing Program has become synonymous with the official start of summer in the Channel Islands Harbor.

Every year since 1992, PCYF has offered our Summer Sailing Program in 4 two-week sessions, with this year’s camp starting on June 17th and ending on August 9th. The program is open to all children, ages 8 to 18, providing learn to sail instruction for student sailors ages 8 to 18 years from communities throughout Ventura County.

Last summer, nearly 165 youngsters either learned to sail or improved their boat handling skills in more advanced courses of instruction. Many of those thanks to donations mostly by PCYC donors, the Channel Islands Women’s Sailing Association, and the California Department of Parks & Rec. Division of Boating and Waterways. This year the Foundation has set its target for scholarships at 45 students, including our first year offering the Warren Totten Commodore’s Scholarship.

Most of the Foundation’s scholarships are given to low income and at-risk campers, with many coming from the Oxnard/Port Hueneme Boys and Girls Club. For most of these children, this will be their first exposure to the boating world. The Boys & Girls Club mentorship program is a valuable experience for each sailor and a part of the PCYF collaborative resources.

In over twelve years as a part of the Board of Director’s for PCYF, I have had the pleasure of connecting with many members and supporters. Although most of our donors ask to remain anonymous and support the Foundation strictly out of the goodness of their hearts, I believe, in my humble opinion, that it is a good thing for the community to know how valuable a resource the Pacific Corinthian Yacht Club members are to a vibrant harbor experience.

The sky was overcast and the seas were flat. That is perfect weather for spotting whales. Two miles into the trip we spotted a Grey Whale. It was ten yards off of *Islander*. We got a great look at each other. We slowed to look and then went on our way.

The great PCYC fleet continued down the coast at 12 knots. Suddenly, just off Mugu, there were numerous spouts. The spouts were very big, indicating big whales! There was much excitement and chatter over the VHF channel 68. Cameras were out. These were Fin Whales. It turns out Fin whales are the second largest animal on the planet next to the Blue Whale. Then, suddenly the call came over the radio. One could actually hear the Jaws music first; David Paulsen shouted over the radio "SHARK". Yes, the Jaws music got louder. How big is it? Very big we were told. You could hear the screaming in the background. The crew of *Against the Wind* got some great video and pictures. It turns out they saw a Basking Shark. The basking shark is about 26 feet long. *Against the Wind* for sure is going to Need a Bigger Boat. The basking shark is one of those sharks we can all like and actually go swimming with. They are harmless.



On the way home to Channel Islands, the Dolphins kicked up their game. They joined in and made a nice escort back to Channel Islands Harbor and PCYC. Afterwards the skippers, crew, and landlubbers met up in Bill's Bar for rum and to tell stories...that 26 foot long shark? Well it was now 60 feet long, and an hour later it had grown to 85 feet. A very special and heartfelt thanks to all the Club members who made this trip special. The boat owners were all gracious inviting landlubbers onto their boats. Thank you, too, to the 30 landlubbers who brought goodies aboard to keep us all nourished!

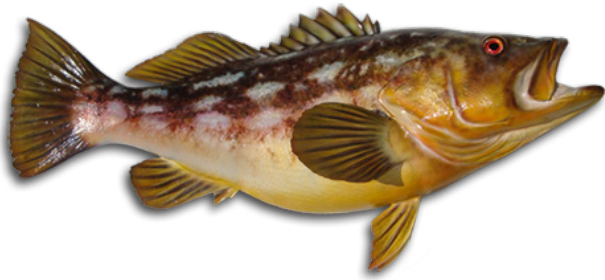

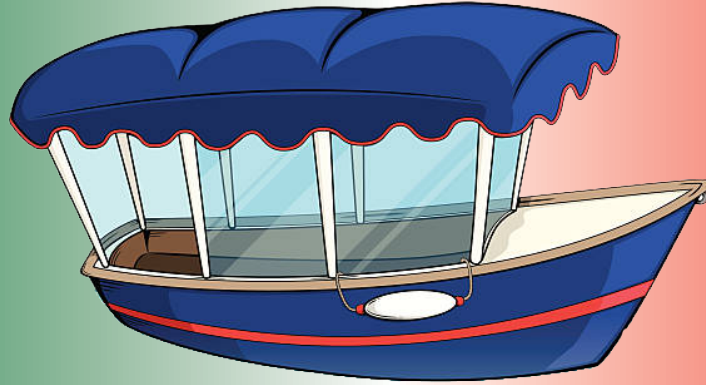
