In accordance with Bylaw Article 18.1, amendments were voted on and approved by the membership at the General Membership Meeting, August 23, 2019. These amendments will be posted on the Club Bulletin Board in the lobby and printed in the 2020 ROSTER.

Article 7 - Transfer of Membership

Article 7.1 – Amendments clarify that ‘transfer’ applies to Regular Membership only.

Article 7.2 - Amendments clarify that a co-applicant who elects to succeed to the membership does not constitute a ‘transfer’ as does ‘transfer’ to an immediate family member.

Article 7.4 – Amendment clarifies custom and practice, which reflects current policy.

McNish Classic Race Recap - Cheryl McMichael & Scott Harrison

This summer marked the 42nd year of the McNish Classic Yacht Race, PCYC's biggest and most impressive yacht race annually, where only wooden sailboats are eligible. The McNish Classic is the final race of the California Classic Yacht Series and was started by longtime PCYC member Dick McNish, a real estate developer and wooden boat fan. Dick is 92, and his boat, *Cheerio II* is 88. Built in 1931 by Fellows and Stewart in Wilmington CA, *Cheerio II* was once owned by Hollywood movie star Errol Flynn. This year, *Cheerio II* took first place both in the Yesteryear Regatta in San Diego and in the One More Time Regatta in Marina Del Rey, a week before the McNish Classic. *Cheerio II* also won first place in its class in three of the last four Newport to Ensenada races, including this year's. The huge crab trophy in the display case came all the way from Ensenada.

This year's McNish race had 16 boats entered ranging from a 25 foot boat, *Senior Advantage*, to *Miramar* at 78 feet. The first to finish overall was the 25 foot *Senior Advantage*, owned by John Thawley, a long time successful racer. John, in addition to trophies and awards, was given his weight in cases of champagne.

The Rose of Sharon won over *Quascilla* in the Schooner class. For Sloops and Cutters B class, the winner was *Senior Advantage* with *Bequia* second and *Silvan* third. *Silvan* also won the Bristol Boat award. In the Sloops and Cutters A class, the winner was *Hidalgo*, with *Sally* second and *Akamai* third. Lastly, in the boats with two masts class, *Distant Star* was the winner with *Marjorie* second and *Cheerio II* third.

Thank you to Phil Scrivano from Anacapa Yacht Club who was our guest Principal Race Officer. Thanks to Kevin Dickmann who scored the race results remotely from home in Oregon. Thank you Race Committee: Cheryl McMichael, Marlena Yokaitis, Tish Oliver and Tom Shideler, and to the Yokaitis family for providing the Race Committee boat. Master of Ceremonies, Scott Harrison, smoothly handled the awards ceremony as tradition would have it. The dedicated shirt sales ladies: Jan Losey, Char Holliday, Dina Gaskins, Sally Brownlow, Casey Schneberg, and Flo Beck sold out



in most sizes of the highly prized commemorative shirts, thank you. A special thank you to PCYC staff member Alivia Rincon, who helped collect payments and staff the table while nursing an injured ankle. The perpetual trophies were polished and staged by Rudy. Madi and Micki at the Front Desk greeted and checked-in guests and provided concierge coverage for dock keys, parking, facilities orientation and other admin-related tasks for the McNish Classic. Club Manager Don Meyers, with Chef Rafael and all the PCYC staff, did a superb job representing us proudly in the weekend-long event.

Most of all, thank you to Dick McNish, a legend in Southern California wooden yacht sailing history, for bringing this special event to our home port each year.
