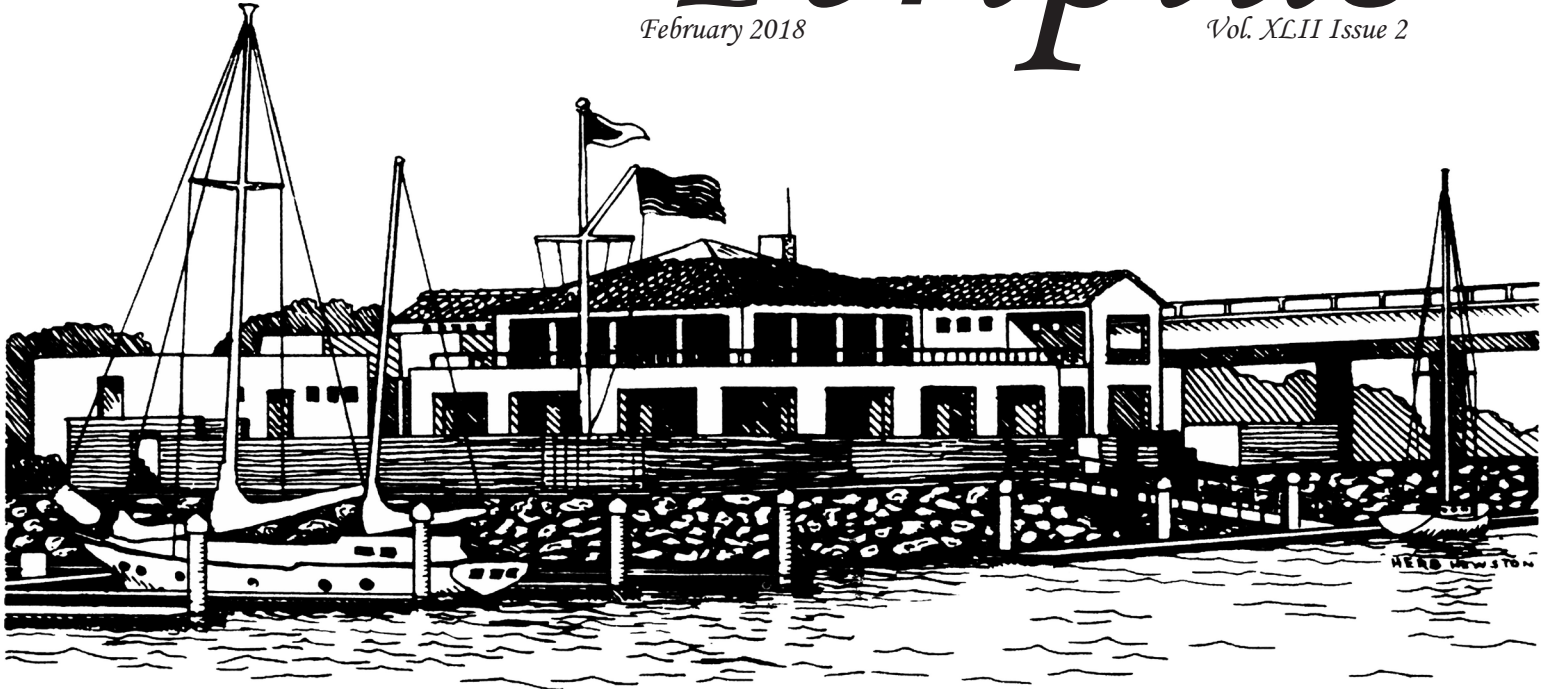

# Why is Opening Day So Important?

For many of you, our newer PCYC members, our upcoming OPENING DAY 2018 will be your first real exposure to a yachting ceremony. OPENING DAY: What's it all about? What can we do to participate? What is the appropriate yachting attire? Why is it such a big deal?

OPENING DAY 2018 presents PCYC newer members with an opportunity to really appreciate the satisfaction of belonging to a world class yacht club. It also reminds our veteran members of the prestige they enjoy by belonging to one of the finest clubs in the yachting community.

In the north eastern portion of the U.S., fall and winter meant that yachting came to a halt as the waters froze and boats had to be removed from the water, stored and sheltered from the ice and snow. When spring arrived and the ice began to melt, yachtsmen prepared their boats for the new yachting season that started with an Opening Day ceremony. As yacht clubs were established in warmer climates and boating became a year round activity, the tradition of conducting an Opening Day ceremony in the spring continues as a yachting tradition.

This year the PCYC Opening Day is Saturday, March 24th. Even though we are able to enjoy boating all year, we, as an internationally recognized yacht club, continue the tradition of an Opening Day ceremony.

On Opening Day, PCYC will host Bridge Officers from most of the yacht clubs in Southern California, as well as VIPs from the government and yachting organizations. It is important that all of us who are members of PCYC understand that our Opening Day is first and foremost for our own members. Come see our display of Bristol Boats and enjoy drinks and snacks aboard prior to the ceremony. The ceremony is fun and designed so that all of us can enjoy our great club. The dinner and dancing following the ceremony is our party and the visitors are our guests.

Mark your calendars now and join the fun. Part of the fun is wearing the traditional yachting attire on Opening Day. We have two versions of the recommended PCYC yachting attire.

The WINTER version is worn from Labor Day until Opening Day and features GRAY pants or skirt with dark shoes. The SUMMER version is worn from Opening Day until Labor Day and features WHITE pants or skirt with white shoes.

Both versions are worn with a single or double breasted blazer in navy blue. On blazers, the Club Bullion is worn on the left breast pocket one inch below the top of the pocket. (PCYC bullions are available in the Gear Locker and should be worn by every member.) PCYC name tags are worn on the right hand breast pocket of the blazer in a position horizontal to the top of the pocket on the left side.

Both versions are worn with a white dress shirt or blouse. For the men, a navy blue PCYC club tie is recommended. Members attending but not part of the ceremony, may wear any nautical wear. Remember, our PCYC Opening Day is your day to celebrate being a member of a great club. Make your reservations today. March 24th will be here before you know it. If you are interested in participating in the planning or execution of the event, please let the Front Desk know.

# Blessing of the Fleet

Blessing of the Fleet

The Blessing of the Fleet is a tradition that began centuries ago in Mediterranean fishing communities. A blessing from the local priest was meant to ensure a safe and bountiful season.

Since then, the Blessing of the Fleet has become a well-established religious and civic tradition, kept alive throughout the world by descendants of the original Mediterranean fishing communities. The events that are part of the ritual vary by community and range from a simple ceremony to a multi-day festival including a Catholic mass, parades, pageantry, dancing, feasting and contests.

The honored and traditional ceremony of the Blessing of the Fleet precedes organized yacht clubs by hundreds of years. The first yacht clubs in the United States were organized in the 1800's, the most famous of which was the New York Yacht Club started in 1844.

A large number of yacht clubs throughout the world now have an established tradition of the ceremonial Blessing of the Fleet. To yacht club boaters in other parts of the world, the "Blessing" is as much a sign of spring as is the Opening Day ceremony. Here in the beautiful Channel Islands Harbor, we don't have to wait for spring to arrive!

Traditional Prayer for Blessing the Fleet –

"May God in Heaven fulfill abundantly the prayers which are pronounced over you and your boats and equipment on the occasion of the Blessing of the Fleet. God bless your going out and coming in. The Lord be with you at home and on the water. May He accompany you when you start on your many journeys; May He fill your nets abundantly as a reward for your labor; and may He bring you all safely in, when you turn your boats homeward to shore. Amen"

Our PCYC Blessing of the Fleet tradition begins with a gathering of boats - large or small, powered by fuel, wind or humans – which will cruise in parade in front of the PCYC dock and there receive a blessing written just for them.

All PCYC boaters – power, sail, electric, kayaks - are invited to participate in the event. Following the blessing and parade, Commodore Jerry Kaufman asks ALL PCYC Members to join the captains and crew in the main dining room for a celebratory off-the-menu breakfast.
