The mission of the Pacific Corinthian Youth Foundation is to teach kids to sail and to add to the quality of their lives by teaching them seamanship, teamwork, individual responsibility, self-respect, integrity, and love of the sea. Our mission was accomplished in spades this sailing season. Over 160 children learned to sail this summer over 4 two week sailing camp sessions. Because of generous contributions and support of PCYC club members over 50 children from low income families got to participate and learn to sail this summer - something that they may never otherwise have had the chance to experience.



I would particularly like to thank those Club members who came to our support when a number of our training boats needed to be replaced this year. Because of their generous contributions we were able to add six desperately needed new Optimist training boats to our fleet. Five of those new boats and some of the happy children that got to use them this summer are in the picture on the cover of this edition of the Periplus.



Lifetime member, Jane Totten, recently celebrated the life of Warren Totten, her husband of 70 years and PCYC Staff Commodore. As the Totten family shared their memories with friends and club members, we were treated to stories of Warren teaching his girls to sail. Warren was an engineer, a former Navy Ensign, and lifetime sailor at heart. Upon Jane's request in lieu of flowers, many generous donations were made to PCYF.

To honor Warren's memory and as a tribute to Jane's thoughtfulness, PCYF has created the Warren Totten Memorial Scholarship. It will be a two week session awarded during the 2019 summer sailing camp.

In the last couple of weeks letters went out to all members encouraging your tax deductible annual contributions to PCYF. A new perpetual donor plaque is displayed at PCYC commemorating all those who annually support the PACIFIC CORINTHIAN YOUTH FOUNDATION, now in its twenty-sixth anniversary year.

We hope to see all of your children and grandchildren learning to sail with us next summer. In the meanwhile, fair winds and following seas. Enjoy the Holiday Season. See you on the water!

Bylaws - Doris Melillo

The Bylaws Committee, in compliance with Clubhouse Rule #21 Notification, hereby notifies the membership of the following additions to Clubhouse Rule #7 approved by the Board of Directors.

7. Guest Policy and Member Responsibility: “. . . All guests shall register at the Front Desk where they will be required to show proper identification such as driver’s license, identification card or current reciprocal membership card. The guest shall be issued a guest badge and shall wear the guest badge, or have it with them, at all times in and around the Club . . . ”

Personal Care Attendant: The personal care attendant of a disabled member may attend the club in the company of and at the expense of the member without frequency limitation. For this purpose, a personal care attendant is someone employed specifically to help the disabled member meet his or her personal needs. The member shall notify club management of the need for and identity of their personal care attendant.

Past Commodores: A Board designated Past Commodore (“PC”) of the Club, meaning he/she is no longer a member, may only use the Club’s dining and bar facility as a guest of the Club without frequency limitation. The PC may attend the Club with his/her spouse, registered domestic partner, or co-habitant as defined in Bylaw Article 5.3 as “co-applicant”; however, the co-applicant is a guest of the PC and is subject to the frequency limitations of Clubhouse Rule #7.

The Board also approved the addition of Clubhouse Rule #27 that states:

27. Substance Abuse: No member or guest shall bring to and/or consume or sell on the Club’s premises any controlled substance that is illegal under State or Federal law. The use of or being under the influence of drugs is inconsistent with the behavior expected of members and their guests. Further, even the misuse of prescribed and/or over the counter drugs may subject employees, Club members, and guests to unacceptable safety risks that undermine the Club’s ability to operate safely, effectively and efficiently.

NOTE: To all members, co-applicants and guests, for complete amendments and additions, see the Clubhouse Rules posted on the bulletin board in the Club lobby or in the new 2019 Roster to be issued in January.

New Member Spotlight - Rick Eberst



Steve and Rita Emerson originally came to the Oxnard beaches to visit friends. After a short time, they fell in love with the area and in 1994 bought a lot on the ocean front, built a new home and moved in 1997. Initially, it was mostly a weekend home, but recently it has become their four-day retreat paradise. Steve graduated with a business degree from UCLA and his MBA is from USC. He initially worked as a security analyst with large companies like Transamerica. But for the last 50 years he has focused on managing his own investment company, the Emerson Investment Group, which focuses on managing the Emerson Family Foundation, a non-profit organization designed to support the state of Israel.

Rita's and Steve's personal passion is with international, tandem bicycling, which has taken them to countries such as Portugal, France, Italy and Spain, with recent trips through Ukraine and New Zealand. However, their most challenging trek was through Glacier National Park, where they cycled to the top of Continental Divide. They both also enjoy daily swimming and recently built a large lap pool at their LA home.
