Fleet Captain Sail - Joe Vetrano



By the time you read this, the first race of the TGIS Fall Series will have occurred. Results will be in the next issue of Periplus.

I encourage club members to use PCYC's sailboat SELAVY. She's easy to sail, and comfortable enough to take 3-4 passengers along for a day's sail. Those who need to be checked out on the boat may call me at 1(805)256-5828.

I'm going to spend the rest of my article talking about a safety item all of us should carry on our vessels – fire extinguishers– those things mounted on the bulkheads of your boat collecting dust. Firstly, there are three basic classes of fires:

Class A - wood, paper, cardboard, fiberglass-any material when burned will leave an ash residue.

Class B - oil, gas, diesel, solvent, alcohol, grease, etc-mostly flammable liquids or semi-solids.

Class C - electrical or electronic fires - wires, circuits, etc.

Portable fire extinguishers are rated by the class of fire they can be used on and also their capacity of extinguishing agent.

The various forms of extinguishing agent for each class are:

Class A - water OR dry chemical

Class B - foam (chemicals when mixed with water form a blanket of bubbles) OR carbon dioxide OR dry chemical

Class C - carbon dioxide OR dry chemical

These agents work by removing one of the three elements necessary for combustion - heat, fuel, or oxygen.

There is a portable dry chemical extinguisher that is rated for A, B, and C fires. Because it handles all classes of fires, it's the extinguisher of choice for boaters. It's only downside is that the powder residue virtually ruins the electronic item involved in the fire.

The Roman numeral following the class designation on the extinguisher is an indicator of its capacity i.e. a class ABC II extinguisher has more fire-fighting agent than a class ABC I extinguisher.

A minimum of two extinguishers are required on each vessel. Make sure yours are the proper type AND are fully charged.

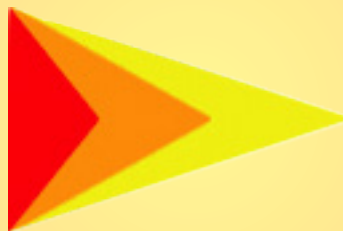
Regular Membership Initiation Fee - \$3,500
